

Bargain hunt at gov't auctions Marshall Artists Series

"You bet there is," says author George Chelios. "The government is literally 'giving away' hundreds of thousands of dollars in new and used merchandise at locations throughout the country for only pennies on the dollar. Most people have no idea when or where an auction may be taking place."

His book, "The Official Guide to Government Auctions," reveals the names, addresses, hotline telephone numbers and background information of federal, state

and local government agencies nationwide who are giving away merchandise and real estate that has been seized, confiscated, abandoned, repossessed or unclaimed. Included are details on the various types of auctions, step-by-step instructions on how to contact the agencies, bidding and financing strategies and more.

government auctions offer consumers hundreds of bargains. "A Porsche with a book value of \$60,000, with only 500 miles on the odometer sold for \$39,000. An antique doll with an appraised value of \$3,000 was sold for \$200. A \$5,000 mink coat with the price tag still on it sold for \$600."

All kinds of items are available, like cars, boats, jewelry, computers, bicycles, furniture, guns, antiques and collectibles, coins, etc. Even if you don't hit the auction lottery, you can certainly find items you could only dream about at tremendous savings, Faison said.

Remember electrical safety when doing fall projects

With the first onset of cool fall temperatures, it reminds people of outdoor work that needs to be done to prepare for the full winter season. Kentucky Utilities Company (KU) reminds customers that when doing fall projects outdoors to be extra cautious for overhead lines that are energized and dangerous.

The watchwords are: "Be Alert, Look Up, Stay Away, Stay Alive."

Accidents commonly occur when contractors and/or homeowners are painting, putting on siding, roofing or

cleaning gutters. Another area of potential danger is when people use ladders or scaffolding around overhead lines. Also, be cautious when using long-handled tools.

While working outdoors, customers should be alert to their surroundings and realize they may be close to the electric service line that runs to the house, or close to the distribution lines that run along the street or at the rear of the property.

Overhead lines, such as the telephone or cable television lines. Usually, power lines are the highest ones on the pole.

KU urges special caution around trees, which can conceal power lines. Children should be advised not to climb trees near power lines or throw anything over overhead lines. Trimming trees near power lines is also hazardous. Customer's may call KU's toll-free customer service line, 1-800-981-0600 and ask for assistance when line clearing is needed.
