his son, Lee Allen, who went to the store to check it out. Lee climbed onto the roof and found a large hole that he said "had just been freshly cut with some sort of garage implement."

"It looked as though we were getting ready to have a burglary," Lee Allen said. "We just knew that was what was going to happen. Since they hadn't taken anything yet, we knew they were coming back. So we reported it to the city police. We asked them if they would put a guard inside the store, but they said they couldn't."

"It's a manpower issue," said city police chief Randy Waltz. "In instances such as that, we could put someone outside, in the parking lot in an unmarked vehicle, because if an emergency somewhere

else arises, that officer would need to respond with other officers," Waltz said. "Afterward, the Allens told us they would put someone inside the store themselves, and we told them to call us if they needed us," Waltz said. "It ended up working out real well."

Two armed managers were positioned inside the store on Thursday night. At about 2 a.m., the would-be burglars were caught in the act, according to Lee Allen. One suspect was able to get inside the store from the roof and walk to the loading dock. He apparently opened the store room doors with bolt cutters and let the other two in with an acoustic torch.

"The managers said they hadn't heard anything until the burglars, while pushing

the torch through an aisle, accidentally hit a potato chip rack and made a bunch of noise," Lee Allen said.

"The intruders went on up to the front of the store to get near the safe, when one of our managers jumped out on them," he said. "It surprised them and they all took off running."

Police agencies then responded and one suspect, Clifford Hunt, was apprehended on the spot.

Two outstanding warrants were posted for Randy Pennington and DeWayne Pennington of Morehead, and they were arrested this past weekend in connection with the attempted burglary.

All three were charged with third degree burglary.

## Menifee youth stabs father in argument

A Menifee County man was hospitalized Saturday, Oct. 20, after his son allegedly stabbed him with a knife during an argument, police said.

Kentucky State Police said Glenn Arnold Lion, 38, of

Denniston, was treated at Mary Chiles Hospital in Mt. Sterling for a stab wound to the left side of his abdomen. Further injuries were discovered during treatment and he was transferred to the University of Kentucky Medical Center in Lexington.

The name of Lion's 16-year-old son was not released as he is a juvenile under 18 years of age, but he has been charged with first degree assault and was lodged in a Breathitt County juvenile facility.

The incident occurred around 9:18 p.m. on Long Branch Road, Trooper Shannon Jones is investigating the incident.
