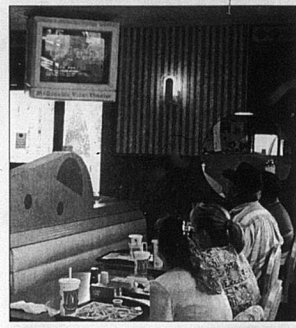


Let Us Pray

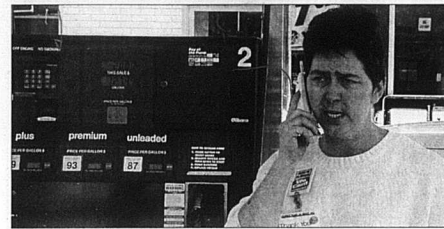
INSECURE FROM FRONT

“Pray for America” are the words on her marquee sign. She put them there early Tuesday.

“I think it’s terrible,” Helen Wright said. “A lot of innocent people got killed and we need to stick together as a community and have a lot of prayer, that’s the only thing that’s going to get us through it.”

“A lot of customers are commenting about the attack and they appreciate the sign,” she said. “A lot of people seem stunned. You see a lot of the same customers every day and they’re usually smiling, but not today. Today, people are really disturbed.”

CITY OF CARLISLE ORDINANCE NO. 9, 2001

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING CITY OF CARLISLE AD VALOREM TAXES FOR GENERAL MUNICIPAL PURPOSES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2001 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2002 ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE TAKING JURISDICTION OF THE CITY ON EACH ONE HUNDRED (\$100.00) DOLLARS OF JANUARY 1, 2001 ASSESSED VALUATION, AS FOLLOWS: ON REAL PROPERTY AND PERSONAL PROPERTY INCLUDING REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY OF PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANIES, EXCEPT MOTOR VEHICLES AND WATERCRAFT, NINETEEN CENTS (0.19); ON INSURANCE CAPITAL, NINETEEN CENTS (0.19); ON UNMANUFACTURED PRODUCTS NOT IN THE HANDS OF THE PRODUCER, NINETEEN CENTS (0.19).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE:

Section 1: That for the purposes of support of the government of the City of Carlisle, and the payment of its debt and expenses for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002, there be and hereby are levied ad valorem taxes on each one hundred (\$100.00) dollars of the January 1, 2001 assessed valuation by the Nicholas County Property Valuation Administrator of all taxable property within the taxing jurisdiction of the City, as follows:

a. Real property and personal property, including real and personal property of public service companies on the Department of Revenue assessed valuation, except motor vehicles and watercraft, nineteen cents (0.19).

b. Insurance capital, nineteen cents (0.19).

c. Unmanufactured products not in the hands of the producer or the agent of the producer, nineteen cents (0.19).

Section 2: All ad valorem taxes shall be paid to the City Clerk, and are levied for general fund purposes.

Section 3: All taxes paid by October 31, 2001, will be allowed a two (2%) percent discount. All taxes not paid before December 31, 2001 shall be assessed a six (6%) percent penalty. In addition, interest at the legal rate and charges for advertising delinquent tax lists shall be assessed on all delinquent taxes.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
