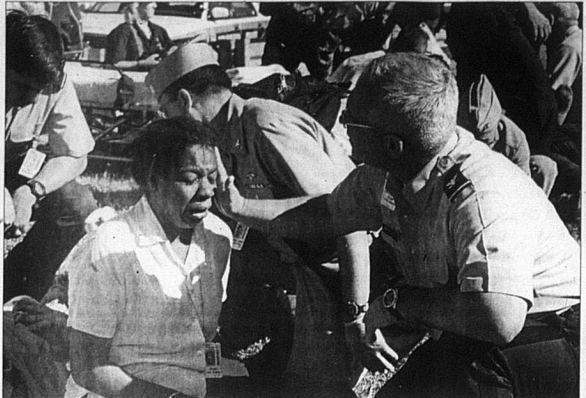

Professor: Public attitudes on security will likely change

The coordinated terrorist attack on the World Trade Center in New York and another attack in Washington, D.C. Tuesday will likely cause a change in the public attitude toward personal safety, a University of Central Oklahoma professor said Tuesday morning.
The attacks, which destroyed both of the World Trade Towers and also damaged the Pentagon, reverberated across the country. Yet the World Airport was closed in Oklahoma City, because most airports in most metropolitan areas.

By virtue of a Default Judgment and Order of Sale of the Nicholas Circuit Court entered in the above styled action on September 5, 2001, and to make enough money to satisfy said judgment lien and costs in the amount of \$54,000.00 as of April 22, 2001, plus additional interest of \$10.41 per dem thereafter, costs, including costs of sale, and any sums payable by Plaintiff for insurance, all valuation property taxes or for preservation of subject real estate until date of sale, all as provided in said judgment, the undersigned Master Commissioner will on the 29th day of September, 2001, at or about the hour of 9:00 a.m. at the Nicholas County Courthouse door, in Catletts, Kentucky, sell to the highest and best bidder that property in Nicholas County, Kentucky, more particularly described as follows:
A certain tract or parcel of land located in Nicholas County, Kentucky, and more particularly described as follows:
Beginning at a point in the center of the Pleasant Springs Road, a corner to Harold Linton, thence running with the center of said road North 63 Degrees 00 Minutes East 99.1 feet to a corner to G. W.
