By virtue of a Judgment and Order of Sale of the Nicholas Circuit Court entered in the above styled action on March 20, 2002, and to make enough money to satisfy the Judgment...

By virtue of a Judgment and Order of Sale of the Nicholas Circuit Court entered in the above styled action on March 20, 2002, and to make enough money to satisfy said judgment lien and costs owed Plaintiff in the amount of \$24,363.08, including attorney fees, plus interest in the amount of \$6.41 per diem from February 1, 2002, until paid...
