One of the major types of financial aid available to meet postsecondary expenses is a scholarship. A scholarship is a gift aid that doesn't have to be repaid and is usually based on a skill, ability, talent or achievement.

Scholarships are available from state government programs, postsecondary institutions, local community service organizations, business clubs, unions, churches and fraternal groups.

Marine Corps Pvt. Phillip S. Shumway of Carlisle, recently completed basic training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, S.C.

Shumway successfully completed 12 weeks of instruction designed to challenge new Marine recruits both physically and mentally.

Shumway and fellow recruits began their training at 6 a.m. by running three miles and performing calisthenics. In addition to the physical conditioning program, Shumway spent numerous hours in classroom and field assignments which included learning first aid, uniform regulations, combat water survival, marksmanship, hand-to-hand combat and assorted weapons training. They performed close order drill and operated as a small infantry unit during field training.

Shumway and other recruits also received instruction on the Marine Corps' core values—honor, courage and commitment—and what the words mean in professional conduct.

Shumway is a 1996 graduate of Grapevine High School in Grapevine.
