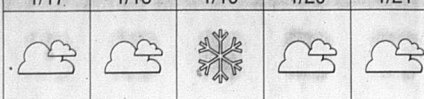

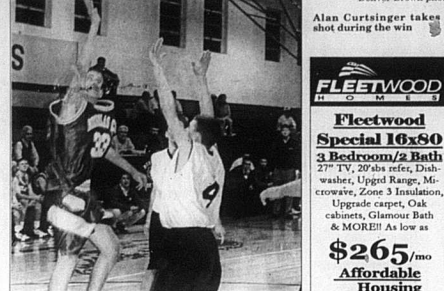

This time, Nicholas County kept going in motion off guard Darin Herrington's call. And they did their best Evergreen bunny impression. They kept going... and going... and going. Finally, after grinding 60 seconds of the clock, Bretz again got behind the high-scoring Gifford. Those two points gave the visitors the edge. Bretz's free throws in the last seconds were gravy.

"That second time, I wasn't really thinking about taking it to the basket," Bretz said of the go-ahead score. "But when I got the ball and stopped, they kept moving and I was clog in the basket."

Storie was clapping hard after each executed offensive play in the game's final minutes.

"This was a good game for us going into the Class 'A' because all those games will be tough," Coach Storie said. "I thought the kids really played tough there especially in those last minutes."

Tobacco companies to buy 227.43 million pounds of burley

The U.S. Department of Agriculture announced today that U.S. cigarette manufacturers plan to purchase 227.43 million pounds (farm sales weight) of 2002-crop burley tobacco.

Major domestic cigarette manufacturers are required by statute to report annually to USDA their intended purchases of burley tobacco from U.S. auction markets and producers.

Data on intended purchases, average annual burley exports for the preceding three years and the amount of tobacco needed to attain a reserve stock level are used to determine the annual burley tobacco marketing quota. The 2002 quota will be announced by February 1, 2002.

Annual burley exports for 1999, 2000, and 2001 averaged 138.8 million pounds, down from 156 million pounds in 1998-2000.

In 2001, manufacturers' intended purchases totaled 225 million pounds.
