Using the alert line takes just a few minutes and is easy, according to Mayberry.

Simply dial 1-866-564-5652. The call is toll free and can

be placed 24 hours a day. When prompted, those calling are asked to provide their telephone number and to up to three zip codes.

"When the Kentucky State Police receive notice that a registered sex offender is moving into the zip code area(s) entered, those who call will receive a notification call which will direct them to the KSP sex offender registry at http://ksp.state.ky.us for more information."

"It is not necessary to own a computer to register for and use the sex offender alert line. Free internet access is available at all public libraries."

"This is an excellent way to stay informed about your community," Mayberry said. "Knowledge is the first step in making and keeping your community a safe place to live. I encourage all citizens of the Commonwealth to take advantage of this opportunity."

earned his master's degree in 1974 and his Rank I in 1981. From the early years in his teaching career, Knipp pursued his musical interests, writing and performing with his now former wife. The pair frequently traveled to Nashville.

"We recorded four or five albums of country-leaning traditional Bluegrass music," he said. Among his songs was "You Don't Have An 'S' On Your Chest."

"That was a big hit for us. A prominent female country music artist recorded it," Knipp said, explaining that due to contract problems, it was never released on her album.

Other successful songs recorded for Knipp including "She Breaks So Easily," which received the Twitty City Award for best written song, and "It Is Jesus," which was recorded by Don Rigby on the Sugar Hill record label.

During this period, Knipp continued to teach, first at Upper Tygart Elementary School in Carter County, then at his alma mater, Halldeman Elementary in Rowan County, where he later served as principal. He finished his education career at the Evon Start and High School Equivalency programs in the Rowan County school system, before retiring in 1998.

Knipp has been involved in MSU's Appalachian Celebration since 1976, booking music acts for the popular Noon Concerts and Traditional Music Night events.

"I started probably 30 years ago carrying a banjo around campus when Bluegrass wasn't cool," he said. "It was

my overall goal to make traditional music more acceptable."

Working with Appalachian Celebration helped Knipp meet that goal. "MSU serves students in a vast area and many of those students are from the areas that play and perform Bluegrass music," he said. "I thought it was necessary to create that area with traditional music at the Appalachian Celebration, we could do that."

An accomplished guitarist, Knipp also plays the electric bass, and to a lesser degree, the mandolin. He says the banjo was formerly his instrument of choice, but he no longer plays due to health problems with his hand. Knipp also has won music lovers' hearts with "Bluegrass Diversions," which he has hosted since 1999.

"The show has grown from two to three hours and has made Bluegrass music available in WKMY's listening area," he said. "It is an incredible show and there are lots of folks who love it."

Knipp continues to perform, with Darvin Streggill and Willow Creek, a Bluegrass String Band, and the White Horse String Band, an acoustic ensemble that includes Leo Blair on fiddle, Steve Rigby on bass, and Ron Dobler on dulcimer and banjo.

The White Horse String Band does a three-hour professional development workshop in conjunction with the Appalachian Celebration. The workshop, which instructs teachers on how to take traditional music into their classrooms, is part of the educational component of the

Kentucky Center for Traditional Music, of which Knipp is the founding director and part-time education coordinator.

Knipp and his wife Debbie attend the First Church of God in Morehead, where he plays bass guitar in a praise band and she sings in the choir.

Despite some health problems, including a kidney transplant in 1999, Knipp continues to broadcast, promote, support and perform traditional music at the Appalachian Celebration. He says he is flattered by the news that he is this year's Appalachian Treasure.

"I think it's amazing, if not the top honor, I've ever received by the public," he said. "All my life, my work has been for someone else. I never dreamed someone would recognize my work like this."

Knipp will be presented the 2002 Appalachian Treasure Award on Monday, June 24, in a ceremony on the lawn of the Laughlin Health Building. During the program, which is free and open to the public, selections from his music compositions will be performed.
