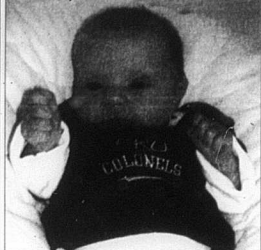
Powells welcome first grandchild

The requirements to be a donor are simple, 17 years of age, weigh at least 110 pounds and be in general good health. It takes less than an hour and you can do it again 56 days later. And consider this. Please bring a friend or family member with you when you donate. Your "blood buddy" can double the good you do. Donate at Johnson Matthers Health Care, Inc. blood drive on Thurs., April 26 from 8 a.m. to noon at 2323 Concrete Rd. in Carlisle on the KRC Bloodmobile.
