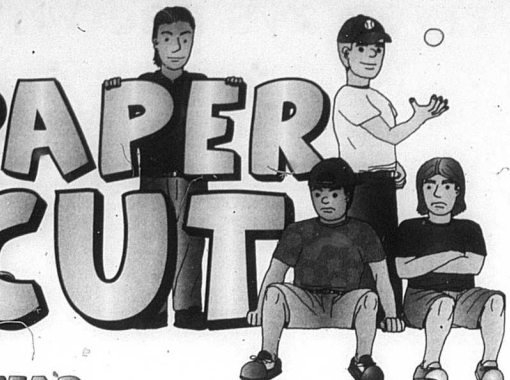

Once you establish a regular savings pattern, you will be surprised how easy it is to make saving some money each pay period a habit.

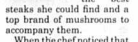
Thoughts from the Pastor's Study
