March 27th is American Diabetes Alert Day

March 27th is a day that has been set aside by the American Diabetes Association and the Nicholas County Diabetes Coalition to be an alert day for diabetes.

It is called the American Diabetes Alert Day and will be celebrated across America.

The American Diabetes Alert Day is an annual, one-day call-to-action held on the fourth Tuesday of March for people to find out if they are at risk for diabetes.

The alert's goal is to raise the awareness that diabetes is a serious, you can have diabetes and not even know it, and taking the Diabetes Risk Test is an easy way to find out if you are at risk for diabetes.

Diabetes means that your blood glucose (sugar) is too high. Your blood always has some glucose in it because the body needs glucose for energy to keep you going.

Too much glucose in your blood is not good for your health. Glucose is not just from eating too much sugar. It comes from the body not being able to use the glucose in all foods properly.

Could you have diabetes? Diabetes is a silent disease. You could have it for years and never know it.

During this time, your eyes, nerves, and kidneys may be harmed by too much sugar in your blood.

Who is at risk for diabetes? YOU! Your risk for diabetes (you) is one half interest for February.

Risk factors for diabetes include: having high blood pressure (at or above 130/80), having a family history of diabetes, having diabetes during pregnancy or having a baby weighing more than nine pounds at birth sometime during your pregnancy.

With the FPG test, a level between 100 and 125 mg/dl signals pre-diabetes. A person with a fasting blood glucose level of 126 mg/dl or higher has diabetes.

The National Diabetes Education Program (NDEP) want you to "Know Your Numbers." Get tested and don't accept being told that you "just have a touch of sugar" or "it's a little elevated."

If you have blood sugar between 100 and 125 you may be pre-diabetic. The HCDPC urges you to contact your health care provider and asked what your numbers have been. Talk to your health care provider about those numbers and seek out diabetes education.
