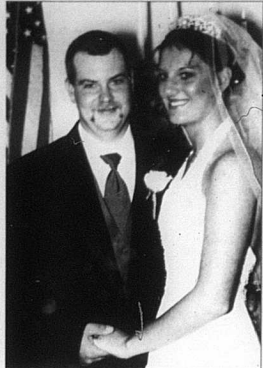

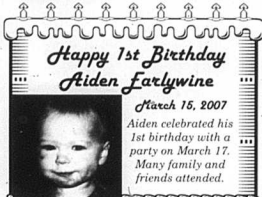

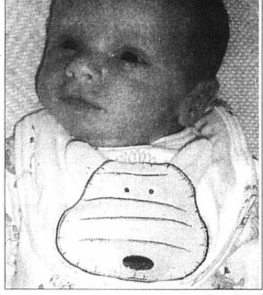

Colorful work of Arts Guild to go on display as new colors will wave

Things are going to get a lot more colorful around Carlisle in the coming weeks. And it's not just because of the change of scenery that spring brings with it.

Members of the Nicholas County Arts Guild have been hard at work in recent months painting flags that will be displayed this summer during events around downtown Carlisle. The flags will hang from telephone poles on the courthouse square initially, but there are hopes that it will be a big enough success to allow the Arts Guild to expand to other areas of the community.

Robert Barker, who helped come up with the idea of attending an entrepreneurship institute put on by the University of Kentucky earlier this year, said the community project of banners has many advantages, including to help "liven up the street scenes while taking advantage of the heritage quilt interest in the community," he said.

"It also helps to demonstrate how art can be used as a commercial benefit to the community," added Barker.

The flags, which feature such pieces of art as the Kentucky Star, also allow Guild members a way to express themselves. Barker, who is currently working on a flag that features the Mexican Star, said he found special meaning in his current piece of work.

"I'm very appreciative of the Hispanics that are in our community," he said. "They're very courageous workers and I wanted to do a flag in recognition of their contributions to the community."

Building one of the flags from start to finish takes many hours. Barker said it takes about 10 hours to paint the front and back of each flag, noting that there was also sewing and artists and artists to become members.

Each flag will be covered in polyurethane to help protect them from the weather. Despite their best efforts to preserve the flags, Barker says he expects them to last only about six months before having to be replaced.

When completed in mid-April, 14 flags painted by the local Arts Guild meet the first Monday of each month at the Nicholas County Public Library and welcome all crafters and artists to become members.

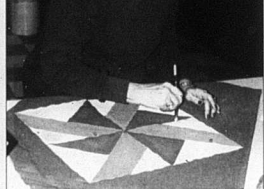
