Assembly work continues on Robertson's Johnson Creek covered bridge

The Johnson Creek Covered Bridge is being assembled and is well on its way to be the majestic covered bridge that it once was.

"If all goes well we're going to have the bottom chord in place by Christmas," Dan Walker, master carpenter who is working on the renovation project said from the bridge.

On April 29, the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KTC) issued a notice to proceed for the restoration of the Johnson Creek Covered Bridge in Robertson County.

The 110-foot Johnson Creek Covered Bridge was built by Jacob Bower around 1870, using Smith Type IV truss construction design.

erchords and bridge trusses, diagonal webs and posts.

They and Gratton have installed a temporary steel bracing system through the existing structure with "bottle braces" to support both the existing bridge and workers' scaffolding.

According to Transportation Cabinet District Information Officer Allen Blair, the Transportation Cabinet is at the two-thirds mark of "bridge work" in its Kentucky Covered Bridge Restoration Program.

Of Kentucky's 12 remaining publicly covered, covered bridges, restoration of Switzer, Dover, Collierville, Oldtown, Bennett's Mill, and Goddard most recently, have been completed for a total of \$9.3 million spent.

shires. In 1976, all covered bridges in Kentucky were placed on the National Register of Historic Places.

By 1980, the legislature had delegated responsibility for the bridges to the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet and the Department of Parks, then created "covered bridge authorities" with oversight from the Kentucky Heritage Council.

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The Burlington Charter states that "covered bridges are vitally important cultural, historic structural and material integrity of covered bridges to the maximum extent possible, consistent with public safety."
