"I'm done with drugs for good," he told this reporter just prior to leaving the courtroom.

When he was then asked what he considered to be the most dangerous drugs currently circulating in the community of Nicholas County, Jolly quickly answered, "Crack (powerful crystallized cocaine) and oxycotin (powerful pain medication)."

Jolly had previously been a fugitive from the law and still faces charges in Fayette County.

He was reluctant to discuss various aspects of his case pending the outcome of his request of having his

admitted probation violations for previous felony of fences. He is scheduled to appear back in court on Oct. 1.

According to discussion in court between Hunt, Judge McGinnis and Jolly's attorney Le Mer Griffiths, Hunt tested positive for cocaine use during a recent analysis.

Griffiths argued strongly for his client to remain free on previously posted bond, and Hunt assumed Judge McGinnis he would not be tempted by drug use.
