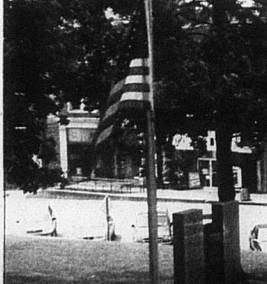
Ceremony planned to honor WWII veterans
