Carlisle Rotary Club receives notification

The Carlisle Rotary Club has received recognition from the President of Rotary International for its programs and services during the past year.

The Presidential Citation was presented to Past District Governors Leon Riggs and Bill Crawford by International President "Wif" Wilkinson during the Multi-District Conference held over three days in Nashville, Tennessee, last month.

The presentation to the Carlisle Rotary Club was the only Presidential Citation accepted by two past district governors. Leon Riggs served as Governor of the 45 Rotary Clubs in the eastern half of Kentucky in 1998-99, and Bill Crawford served as District Governor in 2004-05. Rotary's Centennial Award is presented in recognition that the strength of the Rotary ideal is founded on the services carried out by clubs and club members worldwide.

The citation provides a means for Rotary clubs to be recognized for being efforts in the four Avenues of Service and the Rotary ideal is founded on the services carried out by clubs and club members worldwide.

Rotary's commitment to Service Above Self is championed through the four Avenues of Service, which form the foundation of club activity.

The Avenues of Service are:

- Club Service, which focuses on strengthening fellowship and assisting the smooth functioning of Rotary clubs.
- Vocational Service, which involves club members serving others through their professions and inspiring others in the process.
- Community Service is the opportunity Rotary clubs have to implement projects and activities that improve life in the local community.
- International Service encompasses efforts to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the world and to promote world understanding and peace. It includes everything from contributing to PolioPlus to helping Youth Exchange students adjust to their host countries.

Renewable Power Supply

East Kentucky Power Cooperative (EKPC) is issuing a Request For Proposals (RFP) seeking 200 to 300 megawatts of renewable capacity and associated energy. EKPC is a not for profit generation and transmission cooperative providing wholesale power supply to 16 electric distribution cooperatives who serve approximately 500,000 retail customers in Kentucky. EKPC is seeking to further diversify its generation portfolio with proven renewable resources. These resources can include, but are not limited to: wind, biomass, solar, hydro, geothermal or recycled energy.

This RFP is open to parties who currently own, propose to develop or have rights to renewable generation of 1 megawatt or larger. All proposals, based on proven technology, will be considered, however preference may be given to proposals that locate sources within the EKPC control area.
