Davis spoke of the integrity and devotion of the members of the unit and how

their strength moved them forward. "We lost those two soldiers and others wounded in the span of eight days. The night of the memorial we held in Iraq we had missions to continue with the soldiers went right back out there. During our deployment 14 of our soldiers really grew up and became more educated on life and became a very close-knit group. I drew strength from that."

Davis said he is very happy to be home and has enjoyed being with family members and has also enjoyed doing very other weekend.

He also had a message for the families of those who served with the unit.

NOTICE On July 29, 2008, Kentucky Utilities Company (KUC) filed an Application with the Public Service Commission seeking approval to adjust its electric and gas rates effective September 1, 2008. Public notice of this filing was published in all of KUC's service territory. KUC's proposed rates to its Customers have been reviewed, but were not included in the published Notice. Please take notice that with this filing, KUC is proposing to increase its required Customer Deposits from the current amount of \$15.00 for residential customers to \$150.00 (10.4% increase) or applicable. Currently, all residential customers are required to pay a deposit based on actual usage for the most recent 12-month period, if such information is available. If usage information is not available, the deposit is based on the average bills of similar customers and premises, not to exceed 212 of the customer's actual estimated annual bill. KUC is proposing a fixed Customer Deposit amount for its General Service customers in the amount of \$40.00, with the Customer Deposit for all other non-residential customers being not more than 212 of the customer's actual or estimated annual bill. The Customer Deposits contained in this notice are the Customer Deposits proposed by Kentucky Utilities Company. Lane looks for Nicholas County volleyball to have breakthrough season

Nicholas County volleyball coach Ginny Lane wants to get the 2007 season behind her. Last year, in her first year at the school, Lane's club battled internal problems and the squad finished the season without a victory. This year she believes that these problems have worked themselves out and the club is ready to break through into the win column and reap a streak of 24 straight victories.

"The team was divided last year," she said. "We've found that (problem) out this year. We are hoping to keep things positive and the players motivated." "I was new to the program last year," she added. "Now they are used to me. I know the girls well. It's a close-knit group. They're proven winners. It should be a promising year."

Lane and her assistant coach, Smoot are not looking for the team to have a huge turnaround in wins this year. Their goal is for the LadyJackets to be competitive in order to do that Lane says the team has to serve better and take care of the little things. "It's the small mistakes calling the ball (and) watching lines that they miss out on. If we do those things, we'll be more successful this year," she said. "We have to have more consistent serving. We have a lot of new freshmen and they have had problems serving. We want to see that improved by the end of the season. We want to have improvement from the entire team."

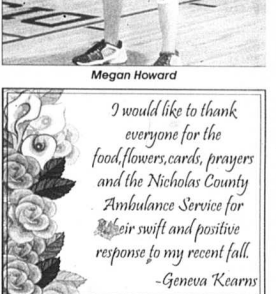
