Nicholas woman faces 6 felonies

A Nicholas County woman has been charged with six felony counts, stemming from theft and improper disposition of the stolen checks.

Carlisle Police Officer Brad Weaver arrested Lori Sosby, 20, Mt. Mariah Road, on Mockingbird Lane in Carlisle on Aug. 16.

Acting on a warrant he had sought and issued by Dawn Letcher, Nicholas County Attorney and signed by Eric Tedder, Trial Commissioner for Nicholas District Court, Weaver took Sosby into custody.

According to the warrant, Sosby was arrested on six felony counts, as Weaver charged her with the offense of Criminal Possession of a Forged Instrument, second degree, two counts and Theft by Deception, four counts.

Weaver's warrant said that Sosby unlawfully committed the offenses when, without permission, took possession of certain checks owned by her parents Robert and Sheila Sosby, and with knowledge the checks were thereafter forged (the signatures have been forged). And with intent to defraud, deceive or injure another, Sosby presented a check for \$60 on July 3, and a check for \$71 on July 10.

On three other occasions, the warrant states, Sosby appeared at Deposit Bank of Carlisle and represented to the teller there that she had the permission of her parents to withdraw sums of money from her parents' account.

This occurred on July 7, \$40, July 8, \$60, and twice July 9, \$40 and \$45.

Also on Aug. 16, at the same location, Weaver served a warrant he had obtained charging her with Receipt of a Stolen Credit Card, an additional charge.

The warrant states that Sosby unlawfully committed the offense in doing so without permission/consent, took possession of a credit card owned by Robert Sosby and made purchases by utilizing the card on two occasions at East End Food Mart in Carlisle.

Sosby was taken to jail by Nicholas County Jailor Jeff Sillies where she was lodged under a combined \$11,000 cash bond, according to the warrants.

Woman, husband arrested for falsifying prescriptions

Acting on a call from local pharmacist Rusty Lawrence, Carlisle Police Officer Brad Weaver has arrested a Ewing couple on drug related charges.

The arrests occurred on Aug. 16 at 1:13 p.m. on Main Street in Carlisle.

Jennifer Buchanan, 22, of Ewing, was charged with possession of a controlled substance first offense; theft of prescription blank for a controlled substance, first offense; and, acts relating to a controlled substance.

Weaver's arrest citation says that Jennifer Buchanan called in a prescription to Carlisle (Recall) Drug stating she was a representative from Dr. Michael Dunaway's office and needed to call in a subscription for Brittany Lewis.

La'Colon Daniel Boone also commanded one wing of the Kentucky force, as did Lt. Colonel Stephen Trigg.

Although official military reports vary, some estimates place the enemy force at 600, consisting primarily of Native American forces.

Reenactment draws crowd

The 226th anniversary of the Battle of Blue Licks was celebrated at the Blue Licks Battlefield State Resort Park August 16 and 17.

Reenactors from several states converged on the park ground to participate, as did thousands of spectators.

Several educational programs inside the park and museum enhanced the battle reenactment and gave visitors a broader sense of the land and the famous battle fought there on August 19, 1782.

Colonel John Todd, commanded a force of approximately 182 Kentucky Militia soldiers in pursuit of a British and Native American force that had entered Kentucky earlier in the month of Aug. 1782 and which then retreated to the area around Blue Licks.

Kentucky militia soldiers followed.

1244 closed

Motorists should drive carefully in work zones, watch for workers and construction equipment, and be aware that construction activities are subject to change depending on weather conditions.

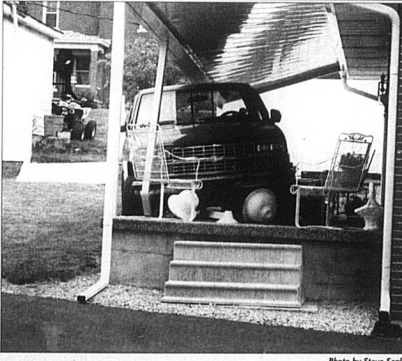
