Black Fish called out the fort requesting that "Shelton" the Shawnee adopted an ed name for Boone, come out and speak to him.

Boone, according to the wishes of many, went outside to Pompey and was escorted to a specific stump, within rifle shot distance of the fort, where Black Fish and he met.

The two men shook hands and expressed pleasantries, as they both had deep respect for one another. After chiding Boone on his previous escape from the Shawnee, Black Fish said he had arrived to escort all inhabitants of the fort northward...

Black Fish handed the official British letters to Boone and he read them while Black Fish and Pompey stood nearby and waited on his reaction.

of the French, British and Native American leaders. Boone told Black Fish he would take the letters to him in command of the fort and a decision would quickly be made.

Boone told Black Fish that while the leaders of the fort were reading and discussing the letters, the members of his force should "help themselves to the gardens and a few head of cattle" that remained outside the fort.

Boone realized they would do this anyway, but the respectful gesture was not lost on the Shawnee leader and he smiled broadly and laughed with Boone as the frontiersman turned and walked back to the fort.

Colonel Richard Callaway, Major William Bailey Smith, Captain John Holdrege, John Gass and others, read the letters immediately upon Boone's re-entrance to the fort.

A council was quickly held after the letters had been read and the militia officers were determined not to surrender.

"What do you say Squire?" Captain Boone asked his brother. "I will never give up," Squire replied. "I'll fight to the end."

As regulations have developed however and provisions of revised standards better understood, local flexibility is available than earlier thought. On June 10, 2003, Kentucky was granted conditional approval by the U.S. Department of Education (USDOE) for Kentucky's state plan for implementation of NCLB. Conditional approval required the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE) to submit several provisions to address NCLB requirements.

On July 29, 2006, Kentucky Utilities Company (KUC) filed an application with the Public Service Commission seeking approval to increase its residential customer deposits from the current amount of \$115 to \$150.00 (100.4% increase when applicable).
