Cadence welcomed home



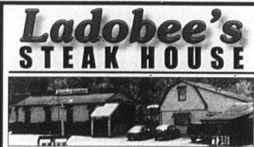

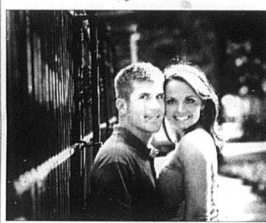
Minton - Kasting to exchange vows

The Gift of Forgiveness  
PSALMS 103:12

I am thankful for God's mercy, and forgiveness. First of all I want you to know that God's forgiveness is for all, rich or poor, the old and the young. Women and men of all colors.

1-God's forgiveness is wide in scope; PS 32:1. Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. (1 Timothy 2:3-4. God our Savior, who wants to have all mankind to be saved.)

2-God's forgiveness is quick. John 5:24. Verily, Verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life.

3 John 1:9. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
