Boone stood before the assembled warriors and spoke earnestly to them in a direct manner for which he was so famous.

"Brothers," he began as his gaze circled the council of warriors. "What I have promised you, I can much better fulfill in the spring than now.

Some of the salt makers were quick to answer and the women and children can travel from Fort Boone to the Indian towns, and live with you as one people.

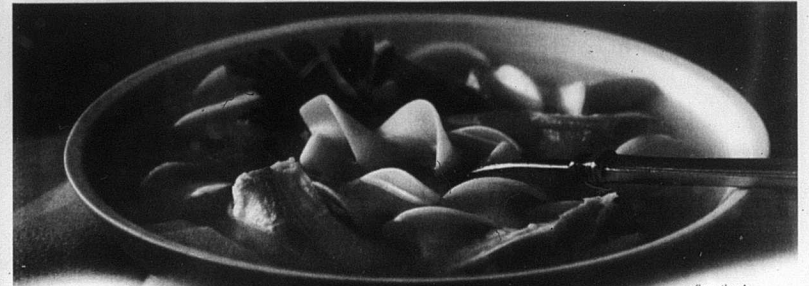
