We all have rituals and routines that we follow in our daily lives. This may mean that you wake up at the same time every day, or travel the same route to work whenever you go, or perhaps you have lunch at the same restaurant every day. Part of my routine is sitting down every week to work on my next sermon. I think people sometimes think that preachers only work on Sundays, and that somehow our sermons simply drop down from the heavens. This is not at all true for me. So every week I sit down and try to figure out what it is God intends for me to preach. The preparation ritual usually goes something like this: First I find a scripture, then I pick a translation, next I work on

a snappy introduction, followed by the body and conclusion of the sermon. This has become my routine. As is often the case we get lost in these routines and begin going through the motions without noticing much about them at all. Until something happens and for some reason we notice something interesting about these routines. This may be as simple as I was trying to choose the translation for this weeks sermon. Often times I have no problem plugging down several different translations without paying much mind to them, but this week it struck me just how many Bible translations I have sitting on my shelves. In my office at church I have about a half dozen different Bibles, and at least that many more on my bookshelves at home. So I began thinking about how I use these Bibles, and about how we all use our Bibles.

Do me a favor, if you have a Bible at home go pull it off the shelf, out of the drawer, off the nightstand, or from wherever you keep it. Now take a long hard look at it. Do you notice anything? Perhaps the wear and tear around the edges jump out at you, or maybe you're amazed by how pristine it still looks. Now flip it open and thumb through the pages. "Liberalists tend to read the Bible through the lens of Mark 12: 30-31. You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind, and all your strength." "Love your neighbor as yourself." Then we see these verses help us make sense of the rest of the Bible. Yet there are still parts of the Bible that have difficult passages, or just take a look at all of the interpretations you have probably encountered surrounding the book of Revelation (it seems like no one can agree on it).

Another section of the Bible people often struggle with is the section of prophetic books. As a Christian I tend to read the Bible through the lens of John 14: 6. "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." Liberalists tend to read the Bible through the lens of Mark 12: 30-31. Mr. and Mrs. DePoy are active members of Shannon United Methodist Church.

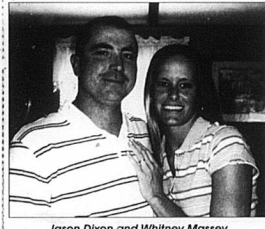
A cordial invitation is being extended to all family members and friends of the share in the event with them.
