and congress should start a National Service Corps. All of the United States' young people would be required upon graduation or quitting high school to join the N.S.C. for 3 years of service.

The closed military bases could be used. They already have housing, classrooms, and medical facilities. At these facilities the young adults would receive education and job training to pre-

pare them for a good future. They could train for half the day and then go to jobs or do community service for half the day. The Corps members would receive room and board plus a stipend for their services. Upon graduation from the N.S.C. the member wanted to attend college, the government would help with the cost. If a member did not need basic life style training the individual could attend a local junior college etc. and do their community service

when not at the college. The community service those students would be required to attend N.S.C. for a time equal to their time at college or three years whichever was greater. They could be used at N.S.C. facilities to educate and care for other members. They would also do community service. Their skills would be very valuable. High school and college graduates would have the option of joining the military service instead of the N.S.C.

Our young people need the training. Our military

needs the students who would opt for it. Our poor, weak, and feeble need the help they would receive. America needs an educated and able work force doing good

paying jobs. The taxes they pay would cover the N.S.C. costs.

cannon that made very earth tremble, besides the constant rattle of musket and the shouts of more than a hundred thousand struggling combatants determined on each other's destruction." Lt. Young wrote that of charge so many years later in his book "Reminiscences of a Soldier of the Orphan Brigade."

Miscellaneous the Orphan completed the charge and dislodged the Union soldiers from the breakthrough.

During the climax of the Rebel charge a singular oddity, such as often happens in combat, occurred.

Young wrote of the inci-

dent later, "I wish here, and in my feeble way, to lift my hat to do honor to the gallantry of the captain commanding that battery (who I learned from Indiana) as doing the most daring and chivalrous act I ever saw performed by an infantry during my entire war experience. Both his lieutenants and a number of his men having abandoned his guns, which were in a battery just on the West side of the Chickasaw road and in the face of us Confederates, who had reached the East side of the road, he dashed into the road and past us, lifting his hat and waving us a salute that would have put to shame a Chesterfield or a Prince

Rupert. The act was almost paralyzing and not a man of the fifty or more who fired at him point blank touched him from the cannon's deadly throat, dismantled caissons and artillery wheels, dead horses, guns, cartridge boxes, bayonets and almost every kind of paraphernalia imaginable were strewn promiscuously over the field. Trees and saplings, not larger than a man's body to a height of six or eight feet, contained from a dozen to as high as sixty rifle balls. But worst of all with upturned faces and glaring eyes, torn and mangled bodies of those who died from the field and at the hospitals. At the latter, especially at the Sodgrass place, there were acres covered with wounded

and many dead. Here I witnessed the most appalling sight my eyes ever beheld, a description from which I shudder and shrink at this distant day, and which is too terrible for delicate and sensitive natures to ponder."

The scenes at the hospital would never escape Lt. Young or any of the others

who witnessed it. And as Lt. Young exited the make shift hospital, he could only wipe a tear from his eyes and protest not to be affected by the horrible, horrible sight.

The horrible loss, why, even General Ben Harlin Helm had been mortally
