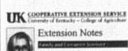

UK COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE Extension Notes

Customers everywhere are advised to refrigerate within 2 hours or discard cut, peeled, or cooked tomatoes. Avoid purchasing bruised or damaged tomatoes and discard any that appear spoiled.

At this time, the Food and Drug Administration is advising U.S. consumers to limit their tomato consumption to those that are not the likely source of this outbreak. These include cherry tomatoes; grape tomatoes; tomatoes sold with the vine still attached; tomatoes grown at home; and red plum, red Roma, and round red tomatoes from specific sources listed at: http://www.fda.gov/oc/outbreaks/tomatoes.html
