Hopkins also praised Florence. "Alex is a great competitor. I could always count on him this season," Hopkins said.

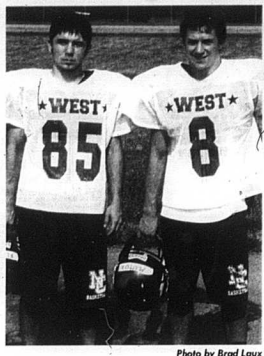

Fiscal Court passes budget, leaves truck

Members of the Nicholas County Fiscal Court met June 10 and unanimously approved the second reading of the county budget.

The court also voted unanimously to enter into a lease agreement with World Wide Trucking for the second year.

"We have no increase in taxes," Nicholas County Judge-Executive Larry Tinscher said following the meeting.

"We're very happy that in these tough economic times we've made a budget crunch with a tax increase when we were able to get the agreement and a new truck that will be leasing."

ation to Nicholas County are reporting a budget shortfall of several hundred thousands of dollars.

"The truck cost you about \$35 a day," Dotson told court members on questioning from Magistrates Jeff Randolph, Darrell Staty and Steve Hamilton.

Dotson had guaranteed court members of a 91 percent return on their investment last year and he upheld that agreement with the same standards and conditions for next year if they agreed to the lease program.

"It may be a higher return," Dotson said. "But we guarantee 91 percent." "I think it's a good program," Tinscher said. "I recommend we try it another year. We save money with it, especially when we stockpile rock."

"Citizens can bring their trash at the Convenience Center at no cost," Tinscher said. "We do ask that they bring no lumber with nails and if they bring paint containers we ask that their containers be cleaned before they are brought here."

The county maintains a contract with Rumpy's Trash Company residents who have trash picked up at their home once a week will notice a slight increase in their monthly bill.

The previous cost was \$15.97 but that price has been increased by 46 cents per month to \$18.83 per month.

the load capacity of the other county trucks and the cost of fuel would mean greater costs for additional hauling trips made by the other trucks.

"The motion was made by Randolph to enter into the lease agreement with the county being seconded by Magistrate Mike Webb."

Nicholas County Sheriff Dick Garrett was also present at the court meeting to give a report on the county's tax settlement and delinquent taxes.

"We've collected approximately \$1.5 million," Garrett said. "That's the most I recall collecting in recent memory."

Sheriff Garrett advised court members that out of state companies were in the process of buying delinquent tax bills and they sometimes charge a hefty price for final settlement to the county owners.

"They might buy a tax bill for \$500 and then sell it for \$1,000," Garrett said. Court members also discussed the contract for the Carcino Community Center (Golf Course) and heard about improvements made to the property.
