It has been reported that our chiropractors are facing tough economic times, with operative elsewhere, because of Kentucky's low reimburse-ment fees. House Bill 148 would remedy that situa-tion by requiring insurance companies to reimburse chi-ropractors for their services and procedures at the same fee schedule used for worklation, the Cabinet for Health and Family Services would establish the Colon Cancer Screening Advisory Commit-tee which would require the Kentucky Cancer Program to establish a colon cancer screening education and out-
