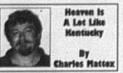

This hairstyle was known as "wooly koo" and was typical of what many Algonquian warriors wore. These wooly "hacks" were often adorned with silver jewelry and colorful ribbons. Not only were the Shawnee clan leaders to be adorned with Shawnee's appearance, but so were the many details of the Shawnee, including Monets, or the Great Creator, and also the Grandmother, as well as the names of other and lesser deities that shaped the spirit world, which was such a large part of Shawnee existence.

study of Boone's rare comments on the subject, as well as documented action and dialogue between the two at a later date, does not persuade me to believe that it is true that the two men became extremely close while Boone lived among the Shawnees, and Boone always gave a portion of what he took on his hunting expeditions to the chief, as a token of deep admiration and respect he had for the man.

As he would dance his way around the village, groups of Shawnee warriors would stop him and ask him in a serious tone "Which way to Kentucky?" Boone would give them an exaggerated pointed look, run wildly in three or four tight circles and then point toward the sky. The warriors would often fall down due to his excessive laughing.

But Andrew Johnson was not to be the first of the captured salt makers to escape, arriving in Harrodsburg in May 1778. Daniel Johnson arrived, he gave a very disturbing report when asked about Captain Daniel Boone. Johnson told his command that he was capturing for now that Sam'el Boone, one of the favorites among that special group of men; that special group of Kentuckians, would never return home.
