It's a challenge to live to that standard.

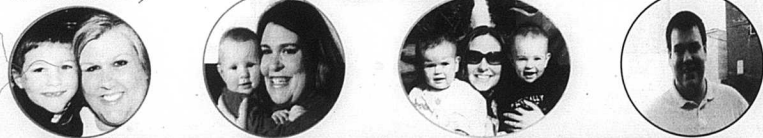
