had looked solemnly at him and asked "What if I crawled out of the fire and let it happen, let my house burn."

Graves also testified under cross-examination by Mattox that he had interviewed with White and his investigator, Jim Combs, in some way. Graves testified that his and investigator Combs' interviews with EMS personnel who treated White at some of the back of his house indicated that there was no soot around White's mouth or in her nasal passages.

"They said she was very clean," he said. Graves also testified that the two alleged perpetrators were but charged her story again on March 5 when she stated that she did know who they were.

"She stated specifically that it was Stewart Jones who struggled with her and Josh Albino was also there," Graves testified specifically. She stated Jones shot her. She gave me his name and said she knew him as a man broken into her home before."

Graves said Jones was in fact incarcerated in jail at the time of the incident and had been for several days prior to the incident. He also said an interview with Albino and others confirmed Albino had a soda and beer in the house with the incident.

Graves also testified that the presence of accelerants used to spread the fire had been detected by Cythiana attorney Jeremy Mattox, White's attorney, asked Graves several questions during cross-examination, to which Graves replied that she had a wallet, which she said had \$800 inside, had been found in the yard beneath a large tree trunk. The wallet was found directly beneath the purse with all the contents including credit cards still inside minus the cash. Graves said that struck him as odd, that two alleged perpetrators would shoot her, burn the house, but place the wallet and purse beneath a tree nearby and leave the credit cards inside.

"She consistently lied," Graves said at one point, and added that when he confronted White about inconsistencies during a later interview she

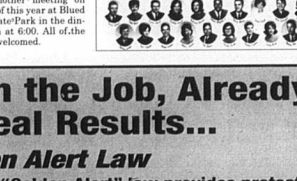

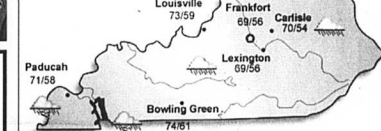

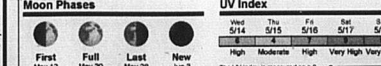
Kentucky At A Glance
