Jackets blast Bracken County, 63-13

BROOKSVILLE - Visiting Nicholas County dominated in every positive category Friday night, defeating upstart Bracken County 63-13 in a late regular-season high school football matchup in a dominating effort. Nicholas County set the tone early on, outscoring Bracken County 14-0 in the opening quarter. The Jackets put Bracken County behind in the opening quarter and the home team never recovered.

Friday night's win ranks as one of the most impressive in the Nicholas County High School football program's history.

Nicholas County clicked throughout the regular-season contest. The Robert Hopkins-coached Jackets played excellent on offense, defense and special teams.

Tyler Hunt led the Nicholas County offensive effort, rushing for three touchdowns. Brandon Tedder and Jesse Smith followed with a pair of rushing touchdowns apiece for the Jackets.

Nicholas County held a commanding 36-7 lead when the game entered halftime.

Nicholas set to host winless Bracken

The Nicholas County High School football team will host winless Bracken County Friday night. Bracken County, a young high school football program, lost to Trimble County Friday night. Johnny Poynter, coach of Trimble County, defeated the Polar Bears 50-0. Bracken County has been held scoreless in each of its last two games.

Nicholas County (2-6) was able to move the football Friday night against Raceland - one of the state's top high school football teams.

Cody Smith and Caleb Pope each rushed for one touchdown in Nicholas County's rout of home-standing Bracken County. Smith provided the game's longest scoring run, reaching the endzone on a 66-yard scoring run in the second half.

The Jackets finished in strong fashion, outscoring Bracken County 15-0 in the final quarter. The Nicholas County offensive unit excelled throughout the game, scoring multiple touchdowns in each quarter.

Defensively, Nicholas County limited Bracken County to one touchdown.

Bracken County was also held scoreless in the fourth quarter. The Polar Bear quarterback Matt Purcell passed for one touchdown and rushed for another. Cody Florence hauled in a 35-yard scoring catch for the Polar Bears.

Nicholas County improved to 3-6 after posting the win over the Bracken County. The Jackets also own wins this season over West Carter and Pendleton County. The Jackets also won 7-0 following the lopsided loss to the Jackets.
