Kentucky State 4-H Star Livestock Judging Team finishes season

The 2008 Kentucky State 4-H All Star Livestock Judging Team has just recently finished their season. They have traveled and competed in the following National competitions: the Eastern Kentucky Contest in Timonium, Maryland, the AK-SARBEN Contest in Omaha, Nebraska, the Keystone Contest in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, the Boiler-maker Workout at Purdue University in Indiana and the Stockman Contest in Frankfort, Indiana. Livestock judging is an opportunity for participants to enhance their decision making and communication skills, broaden their knowledge of animal production and performance records, learn from and meet the industry leaders, and compete with other 4-H, FFA and junior college students from across the country. Judging team members learn to apply scientific principles of animal growth and composition, evaluation and selection of various species. They learn to evaluate breeding and market classes of beef cattle, swine and sheep.

BROOKSVILLE - Visiting Nicholas County dominated in every positive category Friday night, defeating upstart Bracken County 63-13 in a late regular-season high school football matchup. The dominating effort, Nicholas County set the tone early on, outscoring Bracken County 14-0 in the opening quarter. The Jackets put Bracken County behind in the opening quarter and the home team never recovered. Friday night's win ranks as one of the most impressive in the Nicholas County High School football program's history. Nicholas County clicked throughout the regular season contest. The Robert Hopkins-coached Jackets played excellent on offense, defense and special teams.

Tyler Hunt led the Nicholas County offensive of fort, rushing for three touchdowns. Brandon Tedder and Jesse Smith followed with a pair of rushing touchdowns apiece for the Jackets. Nicholas County held a commanding 36-7 lead when the game entered halftime. Cody Smith and Caleb Pope each rushed for one touchdown in Nicholas County's rout of home versus Bath County (6-3) in a game that will go down as a regular-season highlight for each team. Both County had last week as the open date on its schedule. Kickoff for the Nicholas County-Bath County game is set for 7:30 p.m.
