THE LAW AND YOU



Since January, 2007, my office has collected more than \$26,500.00 in cold check reimbursements and fees on behalf of Nicholas County merchants. KRS 514.040 defines A-theft by Deception as "A. Obtaining property or services of another by deception with intent to deprive the person thereof. Issuing or passing a check for payment of money/obtaining merchandise, knowing that it will not be honored by the bank, is theft by Deception. This is a criminal offense, a class A misdemeanor, which carries fines and up to one (1) year in jail if the check is less than the sum of \$300.00. If more than \$300.00, the offense is a Class D felony. Passing a cold check often results in not only a criminal conviction for the wrongdoer, but also in payment of fees, fines and court costs, and possible jail time. I have observed a check writing on the sum of \$3,000 later result in the payment of an additional \$243.00; quite an expensive purchase!

Merchants should be aware that effective July 15, 2008, the merchant may charge a bad check-handling fee of \$50.00; the county attorney may also collect a \$50.00 fee. It is important that the sales clerk retrieve all pertinent information from the check writer, including correct name, date of birth, driver's license number and current address. If the check writer cannot be located, I cannot prosecute. Also, merchants should never accept two-party checks. Theft by Deception is an offense taken seriously by my office. Merchants, be alert and protect your interests. For more information, feel free to contact me.
