Two injured in separate accidents

A semi-truck overturned last week sending an Ohio man to the hospital and closing US 68 for nearly five hours, and a man was injured in a single-vehicle accident on Moorefield Road Saturday night.

who responded quickly to the scene. Robertson County Firefighters also arrived to assist. "Traffic was closed from about 6:45 p.m. to midnight," Buckler said. "Jacks, lanes weren't closed the entire time. We were able to direct one lane through the intersection of Moorefield Road Saturday evening at approximately 9 p.m. to respond to a single-vehicle accident.

The load shifted and caused the truck to overturn," Nicholas County Deputy Sheriff Bonnie Buckler said of the accident. Buckler praised the efforts of Nicholas County Firefighters and EMS personnel

J.W. Moore, 34, lost control of his 1996 Chevy Corvair, which left the road way broke a utility pole and came to rest off the road. Nicholas (County Fire Chief Mark Hughes helped led the extraction of Moore from the vehicle. Moore was wearing a seat belt, and according to buckler, was cited for Driving under the influence.

"We've had a lot of economic devastation in the last seven or eight years here. We lost over 600 jobs when Jockey left and we've lost a lot of revenue due to the loss of tobacco and dairy income at the same time. This will free up some areas of funding we didn't have an avenue to before."

Clark and Tinch said they would work with other organizations and entities to apply for funding. An associated press article published this week seemed to indicate that Nicholas County was filled with thoroughbred horses prancing around behind pristinely painted wooden fences with other fields bustling with green grass being consumed by fat bed cattle.

"We're not trying to take money away from anybody," Tinch said. "We're not in it to take anything away from anybody. We're just trying to improve the lifestyles of our families."
