"Taming Our Untamed Impulses" By Rev. Jack Robinson, Ph.D. Carlisle Presbyterian Church. The Apostle Paul wrote: "I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate..."

She pieced about 100 quilts, but she never quit them. Sue Rule quilted most of them for her. She made this blue and white dogwood quilt in 1968". Naomi Dale would piece or applique a place they both loved to visit.

alcohol, sex, attention, the need for success, and you will recognize the danger. These impulses, desires can lead us down dangerous paths of anger, self-destruction, violence, depression, unbridled pleasure to escape the drudgery of life. Paul felt such danger when he said: "I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. Many of us can empathize with such feelings. How then are we to live with these instincts, driving us to do what we do not want? Three answers have been usually given. One is the answer of self-expression, the second is the answer of self-denial, the third is the answer of self-fulfillment. These impulses, our drive for identity, our need for attention and love, as well as our desires to dominate, feel secure, to overcome our fears. Often the impulses cause us great problems because some of them drive us to the extreme. Like wild horses, they lead us where we do not wish to go. Ask anyone who has been addicted to drugs,

the young and the vulnerable who seek to escape a world of pain they do not yet know how to deal with in their lives. The pleasure principle, a man went to his doctor with an ailment. The doctor said the patient should give up his drinking and wild life. To this the patient replied: "Besides that doctor, what's the next best thing I can do?" Giving free rein to our impulses leads to drunk driving, violent behavior, and actions alienating us from ourselves and others. Religion thus becomes a series of obedient laws - of "thou shalt not...". Such movements have validity. They do allow you to recognize your passions, and then attempt to control them by denying your desires ex
