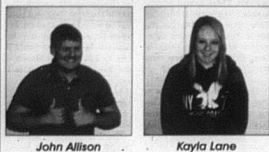


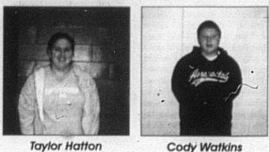
Senior Spotlight

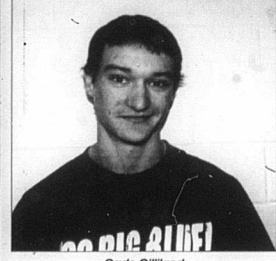
Thank You
