Buckler, Cornett to guide NCHS volleyball program

Nicholas County High School Director of Athletics Robert Hopkins confirmed last week that Benny Buckler and Jennifer Cornett would guide the NCHS volleyball program. Buckler is listed as the head coach on the Nicholas County High School portion of the KHSAA (Kentucky High School Athletic Association) website's Member Directory. Cornett will assist the NCHS volleyball program prior to the start of the 2009-10 high school basketball season. She is set to again guide the Lady Jackets on the hardwood as the Nicholas County High School girls' basketball head coach.

Ginny Lane had guided the NCHS volleyball program.

Nicholas County is scheduled to open the 2009 volleyball season on the road on Thursday, Aug. 13 versus St. Patrick. The Lady Jackets have their first home match of the new season scheduled for Monday, Aug. 17 versus longtime rival Montgomery County.

Two tournaments are included in the NCHS volleyball program's schedule.

Nicholas County is slated to face Bishop Brossart in the 10th Region All "A" Classic Aug. 27. Later in the season, during the final month of the campaign, Nicholas County is paired up against Kentucky School for the Deaf in the Bluegrass Conference Tournament. The conference tournament tilt is scheduled for Oct. 1 beginning at 5 p.m. at the Kentucky School for the Deaf.

Jackets to face Bath in gridiron opener

The Nicholas County High School football program will open and close the 2009 season on the road. Nicholas County is scheduled to open the upcoming season on Friday, Aug. 21 in Owingville versus long-time rival Bath County. The Blue Jackets are slated to face Fleming County on Aug. 28 in the first home game of the season. Bath County and Fleming County are both non-District foes for the Jackets. West Carter (Sep. 4) and Beres (Sep. 14) are also scheduled to host Nicholas County. West Carter and Beres will be the foe for the Jackets. Beres will host the Jackets in a district game. Nicholas County has Sep. 11 set for its open date following the district opener.

The Jackets, under the guidance of veteran head coach Robert Hopkins, remain in very competitive Class A district that also features Raceland, Lexington Christian, Fairview and Paris, all of whom have had runs at state power. Raceland and Lexington Christian view the top spot in Class A last season.

Raceland (Sep. 25), Fairview (Oct. 16) and Bracken County (Oct. 30) are also due to host Nicholas County during the 2009 campaign.

The Jackets have additional home games set for the 2009 slate versus Lexington Christian (Oct. 2), Lewis County (Oct. 9) and Paris (Oct. 23).

The Jackets finished last season 3-7, posting wins over West Carter, Pendleton County and Bracken County.

Senior quarterback Zack Lemons is set to lead Nicholas County into the 2009 season. Lemons enjoyed a successful 2008 season.
