Carlisle Cemetery - 2008 Financial Summary

A summary of the Carlisle Cemetery's 2008 operating account and its year-end financial statements are published elsewhere in this edition. Since income and expense fluctuations during the year of the latest annual report best reflects the overall financial health of the cemetery, the 2008 operating budget was maintained in balance at about \$102,000 approximately the same as 2007.

With generous community support and encouragement the cemetery continues to maintain an aggressive improvement program. As funds become available, damaged or diseased trees that are unsightly or hazardous are being removed and replaced with sturdy trees that will add shade and beauty to the cemetery for years to come. Fallen or tilted headstones, including those recently damaged by vandals, are being repaired and reset and sunken graves leveled and re-excavated or re-seeded. An executor specifically designed for cemetery operation has been purchased. This machine opens graves

more efficiently and safely with minimum disruption to adjacent graves. It also avoids excavating costs for such work.

2008 Income was about the same as 2007 because increased monument sales and increased donations offset a decrease in sale of grave lots. Likewise, in avoided increases in fuel and utility costs and increased expenditures for improvements, total 2008 expenses were also about the same as 2007 due mainly to lower grave opening costs resulting from the new excavator mentioned above.

Board members emphasized that 2008 donations are slightly over \$11,000 compared to \$10,000 in 2007. This steadily improved the operation and attractiveness of the cemetery and stay within our budget. This year expenses are running at about the same level so continued public support is needed to maintain the improvement program.

The overall financial statement shows over \$131,000 in the perpetual

1. Ages 11-18: GARDASIL, for girls, protects against HPV, the most common cause of cervical cancer.
2. Ages 12-18: MENACTRA, protects against bacterial meningitis, an often deadly infection. Especially recommended for kids going out to college for the first time.
3. Adults: ZOSTAVAX, protects against shingles; PNEUMOVAX, protects against pneumonia; ADACEL, tetanus/pertussis vaccine.

Immunizations are provided FREE by the Vaccines for Children Program for children who are covered on Medicaid or have no insurance. We can special order vaccines for those with private insurance. Feel free to call if you have any questions or concerns or want to schedule an appointment.

We also offer the regular childhood immunizations and the ADACEL booster for 6th graders.
