Jackets outlast Harrison in triple overtime

CYNTHIANA - Down to the wire - and then some. That's how a recent 38th District boys' basketball matchup between two longtime rivals went. Nicholas County ventured to Harrison County Friday (Dec. 11) for a 38th District opener against the Thorobreds. The Jackets were up to the district challenge. Nicholas County was able to outlast Harrison County in three overtimes, defeating the Thorobreds 83-78 in one of the longest games in the program's history. The two teams ended regulation deadlocked 78-78. Then two extra sessions couldn't decide a winner. The Jackets blanked Harrison County 5-0 in a third overtime to post the win. Nicholas County improved to 3-1 after recording the win. Harrison County stumbled to 1-2 following its second straight loss. Senior forward Kyle Campbell, a recent Wendy's High School Heisman school winner, led Nicholas County with 34 points, nine rebounds and seven assists. Campbell was 11-of-13 from the free throw line and three-of-seven on three-point field goal attempts. Nicholas County connected on well over half of its field goal attempts. The Jackets finished 10-of-23 from beyond the three-point arc. Five players in double figures comprised the majority of the Nicholas County scoring legal. Harrison County was back in action Tuesday (Dec. 15), hosting Fleming County in a non-district game. The Nicholas County Fleming County game ended too late to make this edition.
