Lady Jackets fall to Berea in OT

The Nicholas County Lady Jackets fell behind early on overtime Friday night and could never recover in the home matchup versus Berea. Visiting Berea outscored Nicholas County 14-4 in the overtime period en route to a 65-55 win.

Berea grabbed an early lead in overtime and never faltered. Senior guard/forward Elizabeth Horn led Berea with a game-high 21 points. Haley Webb scored 13 points and Rachel Wilder added 10 for Berea.

The two familiar foes battled throughout the game. Nicholas County's senior guard Brittanie Soby scored 14 points and junior center Petrea Mitchell added 11 for the Lady Jackets. Senior guard Jessica Glick-

erson scored eight points as part of the balanced Nicholas County offensive effort. Sophomore guard Mandi McLean and junior forward/center Megan Hunter rounded out the Nicholas County scoring with three and two points, respectively.
