The first meeting was then adjourned. John Jones then joined the remaining council members as they drew numbers to determine where they would sit Mayor Clark then called the new City Coun-cil to order and conducted a roll call with all members sent seated as follows: Sandy Ritchie, Eugene Hall, Tommy Crawford, Betty Jo Booth, Billy Mac Gaunce and John, Jones. Mayor Clark recognized all guests who were also in attendance.

The first item of unfinished business was further discussion about an Ordinance re quiring all dumpsters to be fenced. Mayor Clark raised the two primary concerns about dumpsters sitting out in the open: first, an open view to trash around town did not present a welcome sight to people who visit Carlisle; and second, the on going problem of people who live outside the city disposing of their trash in these dumpsters at the city's expense This was costing the City an additional \$200 per week, or over \$10,000 a year. Eugene Hall asked what height of fence the Mayor was pro posing, six or eight foot. The consensus of the council was that the fences needed to be high enough to discourage people throwing their trash over the top. City attorney Skip Watson recommended writing the fencing requirement around all dumpster pads into future zoning and said he would get copies of the wording used by other communities. Further discussion was tabled for the cussion was tabled for the next meeting, pending the Skip Watson's action. The final item of unfin-

ished business was the approval of the payroll transfer funds for the month, which was unanimously approved. Under new business, May-

or Clark announced that the City had 75 tons of salt and when that was gone, no more was available for purchase. He estimated this would be enough for five decent snow falls. He said the Highway Department and some oth-er cities had started using mixtures of calcium chloride and water; and that the city should find out from these other locations the proper mixture to use and then experiment using a tank and a 12-volt sprayer. He stated that December had been one of the coldest in recent history and that the city needed to consider alterna-tives if the winter demands exceeded the city's supplies. such as leaving the flat ar-eas and concentrating only on the hills.

Mayor Clark went around

the table asking if there were any other matters that needed to be discussed. Eu gene Hall asked about the status of 911 service. Mayor Clark replied that the phone company would be coming during the second week of January to test the software. Tommy Crawford asked it the City's little truck had been properly insured and Mayor Clark stated that it

was.

Mayor Clark concluded by reporting that the collection rate was 95% for all utility bills that had gone out. The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
