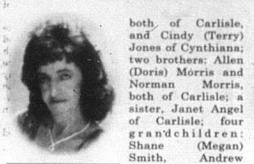

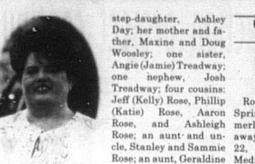

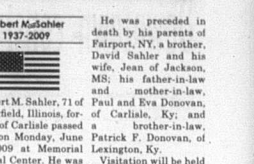
Linda C. Hamilton
