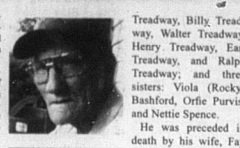


Marshall Hess Cox 1946-2009

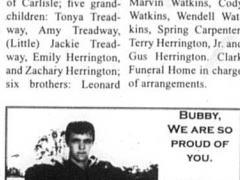
