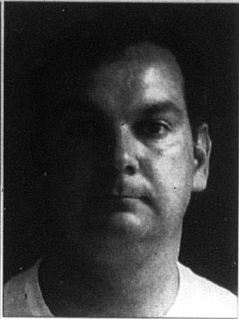
Carlotta Paige Barker

## Bourbon child porn case against Carlisle teacher goes to grand jury

## Windstorm damages property but causes no injuries

Officials say winds blowing at approximately 70 miles-per-hour tore through sections of south and south-eastern Nicholas County Saturday morning causing damage to barns and homes while killing livestock in the process, but luckily causing no injuries to residents. "It looks like it was all straight-line wind damage that we received," Nicholas County Emergency Management Director said. According to Denton, who began inspecting the damage to property Saturday, several barns were damaged and houses received minor damage with most of the damage occurring near the Bourbon and Bath County line, particularly near the communities of East Union and Morefield, Denton and Nicholas County Sheriff Dick Garrett said they had received no reports of injuries as a result of the wind damage, but did state that two horses were killed when they were injured in a barn collapse on Upper Sharpburg Road. "We had a large oak tree that split and caused several utility poles to break and downed power lines," Denton said. Denton and Garrett praised the efforts of county and state crews who helped clear roadways debris and fallen trees and limbs. Denton urges everyone who had property damaged during the storm on Saturday to contact him or the County Judge-Executive office to report the damage.

## Orazen to return to court

Former Nicholas County High School Principal Joe Orazen is scheduled to return to Nicholas District Court today. David Franklin, attorney for Joe Orazen, was in Nicholas District Court April 15 and filed Motions in Limine seeking the court to order the Commonwealth of Kentucky to release disciplinary records of Duany Green, the Nicholas County High School student Orazen allegedly assaulted on school grounds Feb. 10. The Feb. 10 incident led with assault, fourth degree, and also led to his dismissal as the principal at NCHS. Franklin has been attempting to receive Green's disciplinary records from Lafayette High School and Nicholas High School since March 15, when he requested the items during a Motion for Discovery and Inspection. The Commonwealth has objected to the requests stating those records were inadmissible and confidential. In a June 5 motion, special prosecutor Charles Kuster stated that it is the position of the Commonwealth that until disciplinary records are discoverable because they are not privileged and it is believed they will not only lead to admissible evidence, but will also contain relevant admissible evidence. Franklin's earlier motion states and he further notes that the court "must allow the introduction of relevant evidence even if not privileged source. To rule otherwise, for example, would contradict the Commonwealth's ability to use evidence obtained from confidential informants." Franklin's motion explains why Green's past disciplinary record is relevant to the case. "As principal, Orazen had knowledge of the contents of Green's Lafayette High School and Nicholas County High School disciplinary records. He also had knowledge as to why Green transferred from Lafayette High School to Nicholas County High School. As these records are confidential, Orazen will not, at this time, disclose their contents absent a valid subpoena or court order. The contents of those records, and Orazen's state of mind as a result of those records, are relevant as they establish the basis for Orazen's interaction with Green on the date of the alleged assault."
