Registration

Registration and screening for all 2009-2010 kindergarten students will be held Friday morning, April 3rd from 8:00-8:00am at the Nicholas County Elementary School.

For a child to attend kindergarten, he or she must be five years of age on or before October 1, 2009. A child is not required to be enrolled in school at five, but a child entering at six still will be entered as a kindergarten.

Current immunization certificate and Birth certificate/proof of birth Proof of household income for the previous 12 months Social security numbers for all household members

Parents are encouraged to register their children regardless of income. Kindergarten child and provide the following at registration: 1) an original duplicate copy of the child's birth certificate (childhood age or hospital certificates are not acceptable), 2) a Social Security card, 3) a medical examination (physical) done no longer than one year upon entrance into school, 4) a certificate of immunization, 5) and an eye examination done by an optometrist or an ophthalmologist.

This year we are screening kindergarten students on the day of registration so parents should be prepared to register their child and stay while the child is being screened in various areas. Joyck McFarland and Veronica Clark, Family Service Workers for Community Action Council, will be present to register Head Start and Pre-K students.

Any parent who is unable to register during the scheduled period on April 3rd should contact Pam Randolph at the Nicholas County Board of Education, 289-3770, or Joyce McFarland or Veronica Clark at the Community Action Council Center, 289-7172.
