Lt. Governor visits Carlisle

Yesterday evening, Nov. 3, Kentucky Lt. Gov. Dan Mongiardo came to the Neal Welcome Center in Carlisle as part of a fundraising event for his campaign for a U.S. Senate seat in the 2010 elections.

The event was hosted by Dr. Bob Sparks and began at 7 p.m. with a social hour - a chance for Nicholas County residents to meet the candidate face-to-face and to spend a few minutes if personal conversation with him.

The event was well-attended, with nearly 50 Nicholas Countyans in attendance, including County Judge/Executive Larry Tinscher, County Attorney Dawn Letcher, former Mayor Gene Kelly, along with some notable visitors to the county, including Rep. Bonnie Overly, former long-time representative and Adrian Arnold, who died at the hospital in 2009. Dr. Mongiardo spent nearly a full hour speaking to each person present before formally addressing the audience. His speech lasted approximately 20 minutes, covering his background and his stand on health care, energy, and education.

Dr. Mongiardo's grandfather immigrated to the United States in 1910 and began working in the coal mines of eastern Kentucky. When his grandfather's health began to fail, Mongiardo's father began dropping out of high school at the age of 15 to help provide for the family.

Mongiardo shared how his parents had

involve in the Middle East, Mongiardo said we need to clearly define if we are going to over there or not. If we commit to being there, we need to fully support the military - and not just with weaponry. He connected our military involvement in that region as securing a source of foreign oil, and that developing domestic energy solutions would allow us to become more self-sufficient.
