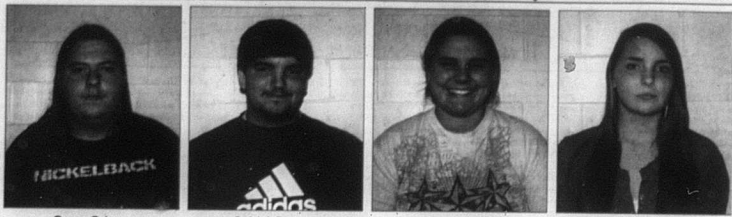


SENIOR FOCUS
