The Rock Climbing Wall, hosted by the National Guard, is an exciting attraction for the youth.

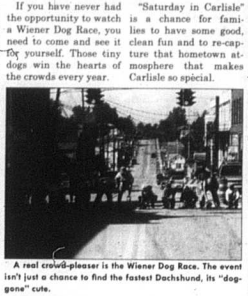

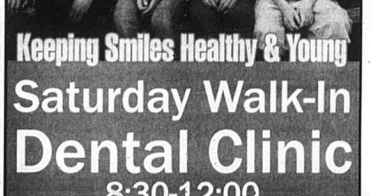
