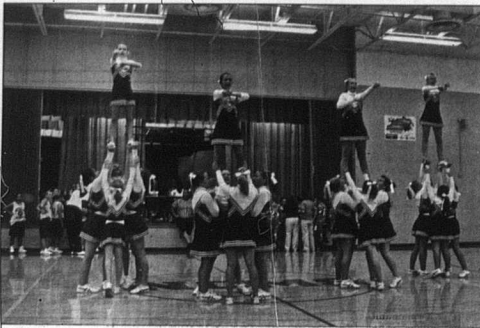

From the Pastor's Study

Now we English speakers might question presenting the two words-history and story. As a general rule history, for us, does involve the telling of a story; but necessarily have much, or anything, to do with the history. The exception to this general rule is found in Christianity; for we who follow Christ our history IS our story, and our story IS our history. In Spanish the word "historias" has two equal meanings; history and story. Now we English speakers might question presenting the two words-history and story. As a general rule history, for us, does involve the telling of a story; but necessarily have much, or anything, to do with the history.

Jesus offers hospitality to those who have been shut out by most people; He says those who welcome the most vulnerable. Tolerance isn't "anything goes," it is a generous sign of her love; He offered His very self to us as the last supper; and the next day He opened heaven's doors through His death on the cross. We followers of everything they say that Christ continue to be or do, but we cannot deny our history of hospitality, and we in dignity. From the story of Christ's love in respect we can work together to help each other to know the fullness of God's love and care for us. If we are inhospitable and intolerant we run the risk of seeing no view of the world other than our own; and surely God wouldn't be pleased if we limit ourselves to only what we know of how great He is. With the recent spate of incivility and rude inhospitality we have seen on the news outlets, it is more important that we "counter-culture", Christians come forward to welcome and teach the world about God's welcoming love.
