The weather was the prominent news maker in 2010 with cold, wetness, dryness and cold again, with few weeks, let alone months, not being majorly impacted by Mother Nature.

### JANUARY

Bluejacket senior Kyle Campbell, stellar athlete for Nicholas County was named third in the regions top ten basketball players.

Nicholas County Fiscal Court members approved the county clerk's budget and discussed employee health insurance concerns before approving to pay \$325 per employee per month, according to discussion at the meeting.

The year started with an icy note with temperatures remaining in the single-digits as the new year began.

A fire destroyed the historic Moorefield home of Henry and Kim Corey on Jan. 8 and Nicholas County Firefighters spent the entire year battling blazes.

Shawna Hatton was named as the new Senior Citizens Center Director, following the resignation of Director Carol, Galbraith. Galbraith continues to work at the center and assist Hatton.

### JUNE

# Grand jury indicts four

Members of the Nicholas County Grand Jury returned indictments Dec. 20 against three men and woman.

Jeffrey Dunn, 28, was indicted on the charges of robbery, 1st degree; burglary, 1st degree and persistent felony offender, 1st degree.

Members of the grand jury allege that on Nov. 6, 2010, Dunn, "in the course of committing theft of personal property belonging to Sam Fulton,

threatened the immediate use of physical force upon Sam Fulton, with the intent to accomplish the threat and, in doing so, threatened the immediate use of a dangerous instrument upon Sam Fulton."

The grand jury also alleges that on the same day Dunn allegedly "remained unlawfully" in the Fulton dwelling and "threatened the use of a dangerous instrument against Mr. Fulton."

Members of the grand jury also allege that Dunn had been convicted of "two or more felonies, was over

the age of 18 when he committed those felonies, was on probation, parole, conditional discharge, conditional release, furlough, appeal bond, or any other form of legal release from a previous felony conviction at the time of the commission of the (above mentioned) felonies for which he now stands charged."

Carlisle Police Officer Benny Buckler testified to members of the grand jury prior to the issuance of the indictments against Dunn. Gabriel Campos, 37, was indicted on the charges of

possession of a controlled substance (cocaine), 1st degree-2nd or subsequent offense; possession of a controlled substance, (oxycodone) 1st degree-2nd or subsequent offense and possession of a controlled substance, (alprazolam) 3rd degree-2nd or subsequent offense.

Members of the grand jury allege that on Nov. 1 of this year, Campos 'knowingly and unlawfully' possess cocaine, oxycodone, and alprazolam. Members of the grand jury issued the indictments against Campos following the

testimony of Carlisle Police Officer Benny Buckler.

Lora Herrington, 35, was indicted on the charges of possession of a controlled substance (hydrocodone), 2nd degree-2nd or subsequent offense, and possession of drug paraphernalia. The alleged offenses occurred on Oct. 27 of this year, according to the indictments, which were issued by members of the grand jury following the testimony of Carlisle Chief of Police William Denton.

Robert Bussell, 46, was indicted on the charge of receiving stolen property (firearm). The alleged crime occurred on Aug. 15, of this year when Bussell allegedly 'received, retained, or disposed of a firearm which belonged to William Carson, knowing or having reason to believe that it had been stolen', according to the indictment.

Carlisle Police Officer Benny Buckler testified to members of the grand jury prior to the issuance of the indictment against Bussell.

All persons are innocent until proven guilty or pleading guilty.

## Heaven Is A Lot Like Kentucky

The snow made that old familiar squeaking crunch beneath my boot as I made my way across the meadow and into the tree line that surrounds my home this past weekend.

A near-fatal fall three years ago had nearly torn my left leg from my body and did succeed in destroying my main patella tendon and thus left me in need of serious knee surgery and has kept me fairly immobile for the past two winters.

So I finally took a fairly good walk in the snow over the Christmas Break; the only winter journey I've undertaken since the accident.

As I continued my trek into the woods I was continually reminded of similar trips, oh so many years ago when my late father and I were permanent fixtures in the woods and streams of the secluded areas of Fleming, Bath and Nicholas Counties in the early and mid 1970s.

My father was an unequalled outdoorsman and a master fisherman, hunter and especially trapper. And yet he was also a good steward of the land, even raising quail and turning lose hundreds of pairs of them to ensure their survival in the region.

And so as I made my way across the meadows and woods near my home my mind was a blur of memories and delightful realization that my knee, which I once feared might never work again, was working fine and I was pain free, except for the cold.

I don't like cold weather and never have.

I used to marvel at how my father could endure the cold as we made our way along the various trap lines in the winter. He would inevitably become soaked and encrusted in ice and snow and I can't say I ever heard him complain.

He, like most of his generation, had been a soldier and caught the end of WW II and left the service about four years later as the Korean conflict escalated.

I used to complain about being cold when we were miles from his truck in the dead of winter but he would just look at me and say in a monotone voice, "it could be a lot colder, son."

And I was reminded of that and other things this past weekend as I made my way along and watched my dog bounce through the snow. I grew up with dogs; wonderful hunting dogs, but we never took any dogs with us on the trap lines. It was always just me and dad.

Dad would sometimes tell me of the misery of a Korean winter and since he wasn't one to complain about personal hardship, I knew the cold he had experienced must have been remarkable. As I grew older I heard of similar stories from men who had experienced a Korean winter.

My father had never known the frozen horror that tattooed all Americans in Korea who survived the terrible Chinese offense near the Chosin Reservoir in the winter of 1950/51. His tour of duty had ended and he was home, but I knew he was close to some of those who he had left behind in Korea at the end of his tour of duty.

I became entranced with certain battles of World War Two and Korea, one in particular

last day of fighting on Iwo Jima, a full month after the flag was raised.

I still spend some time at his grave in Elizaville Cemetery. About two rows above Franklin's monument is a simple granite block of stone with the name Donald Maddox inscribed upon it. The stone also has the inscription "CPL. US ARMY Korean War Apr. 21, 1929-Jan. 31, 1951."

My quest to know this man began a decade ago as I felt he might be "of distant kin" to me, though when I asked my father, before he passed, he had only said "maybe distant kin." My

research since has indicated nothing different.

Donald Maddox was a member of L Company, 31 Regiment, 7th Infantry Division, serving near the Korean villages of Hanhung and Hungman in December 1950 and was with units that fought extensively around the Chosin Reservoir before the God-awful frozen retreat in the face of overwhelming Chinese forces.

Donald was captured by enemy forces on Dec. 12, 1950. Donald's family, including his twin sister, received word that Donald had "died of malnutrition while in the hands of the enemy"

according to the Dept. of Defense's correspondence sent to the grieving family several months later.

Neither Donald's body nor any of his personal effects were ever returned home to his family. His grave is empty in Elizaville Cemetery.

I started thinking about that as I made my way through the frozen woods this weekend. Started thinking about the 8,200 American soldiers that have never been accounted for and who "disappeared" during the Korean War.

Those men deserved a Hell of a lot better than what they got. So did their families.

I became so upset over the disgraceful fact as I thought on

it this weekend, that I began trembling as I made my way back home toward my warm home.

I was trembling from disgrace and from the cold and I could hear, as a distant and knowing voice, the words of my late father as he spoke them too me so many years ago, "It could be a lot colder, son."

I knew I was truly cold, but probably not nearly as cold as a 21-year-old American soldier being prodded by bayonet point across a foreign and frozen landscape.

I knew that indeed I could be a lot colder.

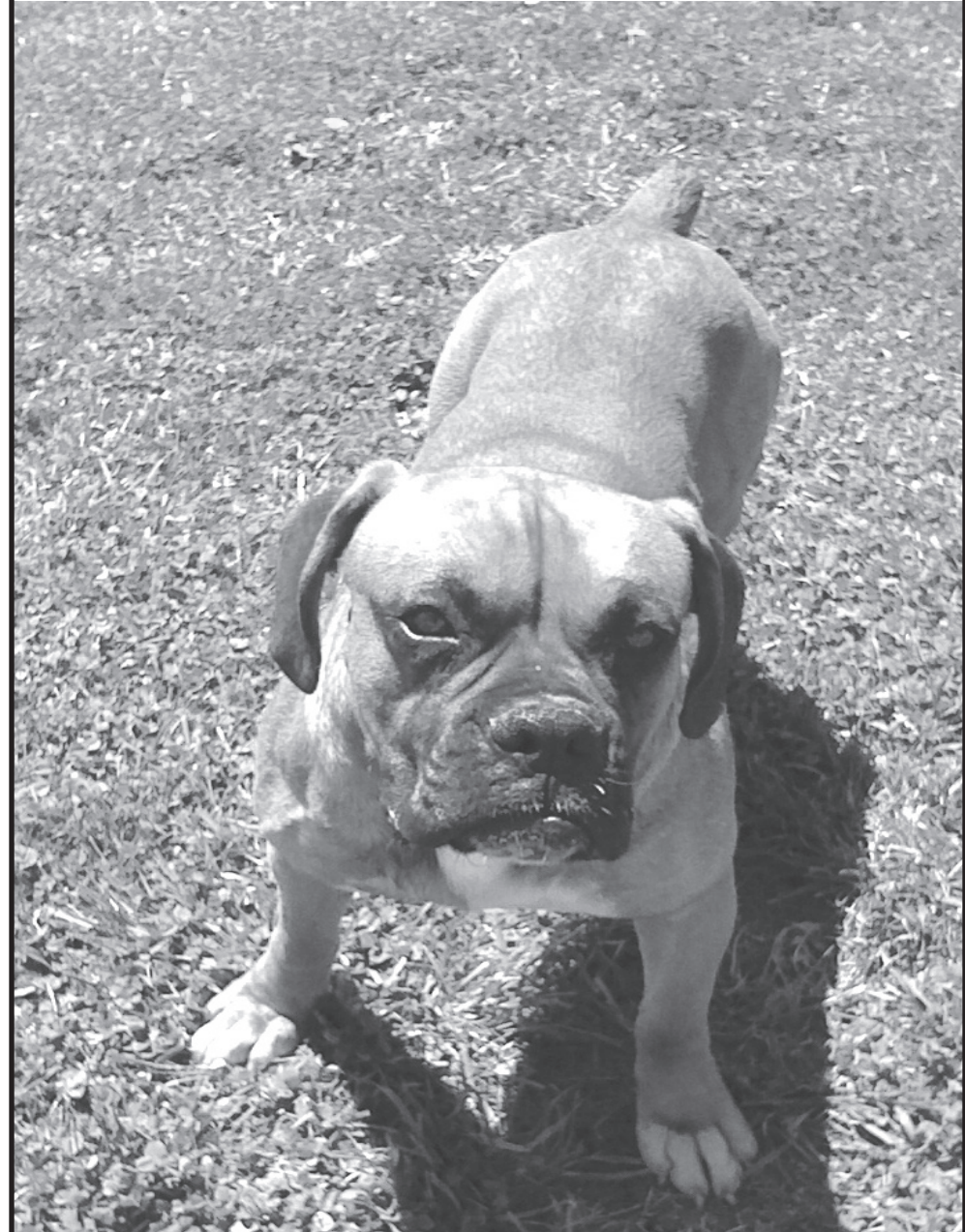

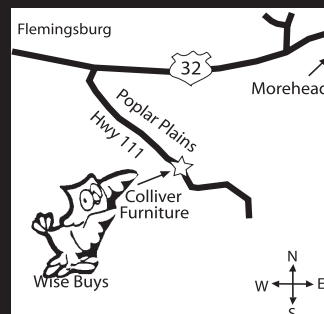

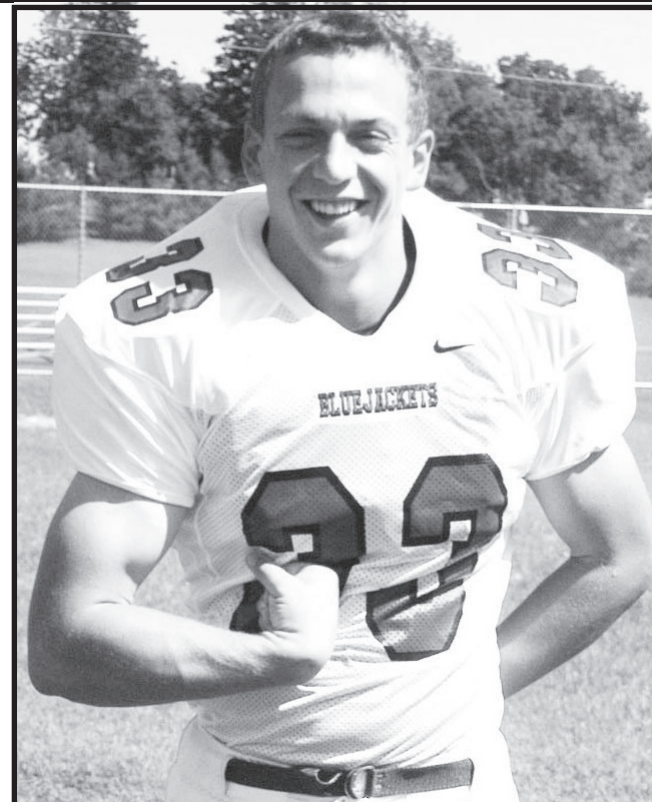

Winter arrives early with single-digit temperatures and lots and lots of snow causing havoc for motorists and causing school to be closed for several days.

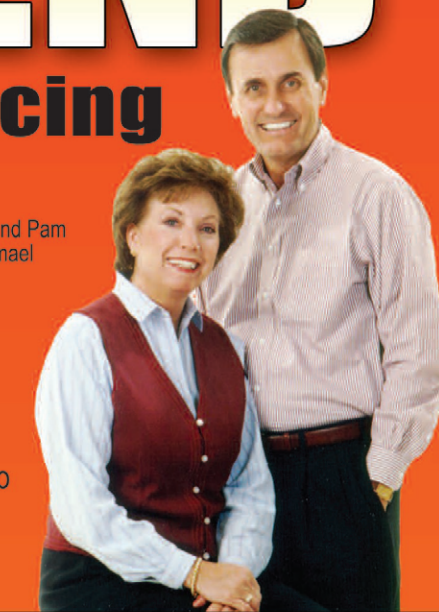
