# Area man charged with murder

An area man turned himself in after allegedly shooting a Paris father and son on Christmas day.

William C. 'Willie' Ross, 36, who lists his address as Sharpsburg, but who has been a long-time resident of Ewing, particularly having resided for many years on Abner's Mills Road along

the Fleming/Nicholas County border, remains lodged in the Bourbon County Detention Center, charged with the murder of Leroy Richardson, 57, of Paris.

Ross allegedly went to the Richardson home on Christmas day, and shot Richardson and his son, Joey Richardson.

Ross turned himself in later Christmas day after an arrest warrant was issued for him.

"This is still an ongoing in-

vestigation," Veteran Kentucky State Police Detective Sgt. Jeremy Murrell of the Dry Ridge Post said Tuesday morning. "We are still working very actively on this."

Leroy Richardson was pronounced dead on the scene at his home along Levy Road in North Middletown and his son, Joey Richardson, remains in critical condition at the UK Medical Center, where he was transported following the shooting.

Paris and North Mid-

dletown Firefighters were among the first to respond to the scene that day.

Firefighter Greg Barnett confirmed that first responders did everything in their power to preserve the life of Mr. Richardson and his son but in a still shaking voice declined to comment on what first responders witnessed when they entered the residence.

Ross remains lodged in the Bourbon County Re-

## Fire board to press charges against Chief Hughes

In a surprise move the Nicholas County Fire Department Board announced during a special called meeting last Tuesday evening that it would be pressing charges against County Fire Chief Mark Hughes.

The nature of the charges was not specified, and Fire Board Chair David Smith would not comment following the meeting about the board's actions, but sources says that the charges are related to maintenance work on a fire truck supposedly charged by Hughes to the board but not actually done.

The board met in closed session for over two hours to discuss the issue. Following the closed session, Smith announced that formal charges would be filed against Hughes and would be presented to him this week.

Smith also said that Hughes would remain in his position as Fire Chief but that would not be allowed to undertake anymore maintenance for the fire depart-

ment. While the board was meeting in executive session, Hughes said, "You can't tell me they could put somebody out after 34 years over maintenance."

Hughes said that there would have been no issue

had he been given a proper job description, which he noted was required by the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

Hughes added that the maintenance issue was brought up by four board members appointed during

the previous administration and that this issue is nothing more than personal.

There were no charges filed at the time this newspaper went to press, but The Carlisle Mercury will continue to follow this story as it develops.

# 2011 in one word. . . wet

The rain continues to fall at press time. When the rain began to fall Tuesday morning, the record was just a half of an inch away. The previous wettest year ever was 65 and 3/4 inches and was set way back in 1936.

As of 6:00 a.m. the rain gage at Blue Grass Airport had tipped the record by showing six tenths of an inch of rain. With the rain still falling, and four more days left in the year, the record will continue to rise. Up to one of inch of rain is expected with the current system that is moving

through.

Also on the record book is the month of April. It was the wettest April of all time. The month of November chimed in as well. It went down as the second wettest November of all time.

The weather has continued to be unseasonable warm, the average high for December is 44 and the average low is 28. Local weather sources are showing the lows this week are about where our average highs should be. Starting Friday temperatures should be near 50 degrees with highs going up from there as Monday and Tuesday top out at 55 and 54 degrees respectively according to weather sources.

## Barnett appears for hearing, murder charge bound over

Amid heightened security, alleged murderer Gary Barnett, 64, of Nicholas County, appeared in Robertson District Court Dec.22 for a preliminary hearing.

Robertson District Court Judge, Honorable William Kuster, found probable cause on the charge of murder and had that charge bound over to a future Robertson County Grand Jury.

More information emerged at the hearing regarding the brutal murder of Angie Spencer, 71, of 6367 Kenton-town Road, who perished in her own home, amid Christmas decorations in the early morning of Dec. 10.

Spencer fought for her life and tried to defend herself, her friend and her home, before her life ended as a re-

sult of being struck in the chest with a single round fired from a .357 handgun, according to testimony provided during the hearing.

Jesse Melcher, the County Attorney for Robertson County called a single witness to provide testimony during the hearing.

Veteran Kentucky State Police Detective Chris Jascoviak answered all questions posed to him by Melcher and by Attorney Gwen Pollard of Falmouth, who is representing Barnett.

Pollard met briefly with Barnett prior to the hearing after seeking approval from Robertson County Jailer Eddie Jacobs. Jacobs remained diligent throughout the court appearance, before, during and after Barnett's hearing watching him carefully and exercising caution with him throughout his

## Heaven Is A Lot Like Kentucky

among the 30 inhabitants who had once occupied John Grant's Station, having moved there from Bryant's Station.

The Stuckers were of Swedish descent. Young Jacob's grandfather had immigrated to Pennsylvania from Sweden. The Pennsylvania Dutch craftsmen were wonderful gunsmiths who perfected the accuracy of the Kentucky Long Rifle.

Jacob's father and uncle had arrived in Kentucky in January of 1780 at Bryant's Station. They immediately found their dreams in the Kentucky wilderness around the fields of the John Grant's fort, a haven for many Pennsylvania Dutch, including their kinsman Michael Stoner. The Grants had inter-married into the Boone clan and they along with other families had begun to carve out a home in the wilderness.

There had been so many dreams they had hoped to realize, but those dreams were all gone now, not even one year later. The British invasion of Kentucky in the summer of 1780 had destroyed those dreams with the same methodical violence with which it had destroyed Isaac Ruddle's and John Martin's Station. A splinter group of British

General Henry Bird's enemy force had destroyed Grant's Station and killed several of its inhabitants including Jacob's parents and his uncle.

The transformation in young Jacob following the death of his parents had been something that the entire frontier was ablaze with. He had devoted himself completely to the defense of the territory.

Even the elder militia officer Daniel Boone had been dismayed at young Jacob's change.

His skills in the woods had impressed them all, even to the point that when Shawnee raiders had killed Edward Boone, Daniel's brother, in October of 1780, Jacob had been nominated for the shared command of a group of nearly 65 of the most enduring militia soldiers on the frontier who followed the group of raiders all the way to the Ohio River, but the Shawnee raiding party had escaped.

Boone had earlier appointed Jacob as a militia spy for the settlements near the Licking River and the dangerous job had provided Jacob with a means to care for his broken family.

And now the remnants

of the Stucker family, mostly children, were standing there in the desolate wilderness, at the small cemetery where several of the Stucker family members would eternally remain.

Promises were made there.

Those promises were kept, dear reader

Jacob Stucker had become strong at the broken places.

His maniacal devotion would be the salvation of many of Kentucky's earliest families.

It would also be the instrument of destruction for many clansmen of the Children of the Panther and

the Children of the Crane, among the Shawnee kinship groups and their Native American families.

I continue my research into the life of Jacob Stucker, having on more than one occasion held documents he had marked with a firm "X" below where someone had scrawled his name.

We wait for spring as winter sweeps across our frozen landscape.

And just as has been the case for so many generations of Kentuckians before us, we await spring's blossoms as we grow strong in the patient cold of winter.

We grow strong at the broken places.

*"The world breaks every one and afterward many are strong at the broken places. But those that will not break; it kills. It kills the very good and the very gentle and the very brave impartially. If you are none of these you can be sure it will kill you too but there will be no special hurry."*

From Pulitzer Prize-winning writer Ernest Hemingway, from chapter 34 of his semi-autobiographical novel: "A Farewell to Arms".

**Winter of 1780/1781, during the Christmas/New Year season, at the burnt remnants of what was once John Grant's Station.**

They stood awkwardly there by the graves for a while before Jacob motioned them away.

They had placed a small cedar bough wreath between the wooden crosses and Jacob had tied hawk feathers to them and the wind made them dance above the otherwise frozen

appearance. Jacobs was assisted by two deputy jailers and Robertson County Justice Center security staff.

Family members of Barnett and Spencer were present in the courtroom during the hearing.

Barnett was shackled in handcuffs and ankle manacles, and his physical appearance seemed emaciated and gaunt. He wore a singular weary expression on his face throughout the proceedings, remaining completely silent except for an occasional whisper to Pollard, who sat immediately to his left.

A noticeable scar was visible upon Barnett's right ear and cartilage from the top of his ear was missing.

Angie Spencer had died fighting for her life, managing to fire a single round from a .38 caliber handgun moments just before or immediately after being struck in the chest from a projectile fired from Barnett's handgun, according to Det. Jascoviak's testimony.

Det. Jascoviak testified that Barnett had made threatening phone calls to Spencer's sister, whom he identified as "Barbara Moore."

Barnett had made "multiple" phone calls threatening to kill Moore, Spencer and David Gallenstein, a friend of Spencer's, after Moore had moved out of Barnett's Nicholas County home; following a relationship in which the two lived together for approximately two and one half years, according to Jascoviak's testimony.

Jascoviak said the threatening calls had begun in November and KSP detectives had physical evidence including at least one phone to support that.

Moore had been staying at Spencer's home but was with a friend in Grant

County on the night of Spencer's murder.

Barnett arrived at Spencer's home, made threatening statement, attempted to gain entry into the home and fired at least four shots from his .357 handgun at the rear and front of the Spencer home, according to Jascoviak's testimony.

Barnett shot the lock off of the rear door and then ran to the front of the home

when he could not gain entry in the rear, due to a dead-bolt lock securing the door.

As Gallenstein was calling 911 for help, Spencer retrieved her .38 caliber pistol as Barnett began firing into the front door.

Barnett left the home after being struck in the right ear, driving back to Nich-

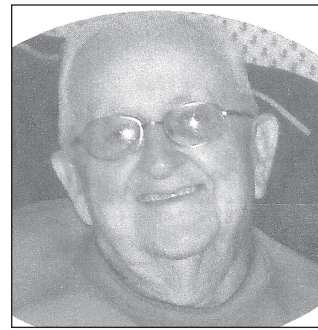

## Warm Feet, Warm Hearts delivers

Warm Feet, Warm Heart Inc. is a charity based out of Georgetown Kentucky. Their mission is to help purchase shoes for needy children in Nicholas and some of the surrounding chari-

ties. To get the word out, Donald and Wanda Ritchie placed a "Shoe Tree" in the Nicholas County Public Library. The "Shoe Tree" was covered with "ornaments". These "ornaments" contain the size of a shoe, along with whether shoe is for a boy or a girl. People came out in droves

to help support the cause. In total 73 pair of shoes were delivered to the Community Action Council for 31 families in Nicholas County. In total 215 pair of shoes were collected for the four counties that Warm Feet, Warm Heart Inc. serviced.

According to Daryl Moore, Chairman of the Norma Jean Eals Warm Feet Warm Hearts Inc., "The charity is named for my mother, Norma Jean Eals. Mom always had a problem with swelling in her feet and ankles so she never could wear the "nice shoes" she liked. She would wear tennis shoes with her church dresses. She was hospitalized in October of 2010 and began dialysis which was supposed to take all of the swelling out of her feet and ankles. Of course, by now they were swelled unbelievably large. We were talking in the waiting room about how we should all by her shoes for Christmas, just because she would be able

to wear them. Come to find out she was a lot sicker than we had thought. She passed away November 30, 2010 of complications from Lupus. Later we had the idea to still buy her the shoes, but donate them to someone in need. The idea snowballed, and on Christmas day that year I discussed the idea of starting a non-profit organization to provide needy children with shoes, with my two sisters. So here we are, getting set to have our first large distribution of shoes."

Moore also said, "This charity is important to all the board of directors. Not just because it bears my mother's name, but because of the children. Given the economy these days, there are a lot of different reasons people can't afford shoes for their children. Some of the reasons may be the adults own fault or nobody's fault, but it sure isn't the child's fault they don't have warm shoes."

Nicholas County. Witnesses at the scene identified Barnett as the man who fired shots into the home and Det. Jascoviak and other KSP officers arrested Barnett at his Nicholas County home later that same day.

They recovered spent casings and a .357 Rugar Blackhawk revolver handgun from Barnett's home.

Police also recovered one of the projectiles Barnett allegedly fired into the home.

"We believe it was the projectile that entered Mrs. Spencer's chest and exited her back and then lodged in the bedroom door frame," Jascoviak testified amid the silence of the courtroom.

Jascoviak said additional charges were likely to be filed against Barnett and evidence indicated that Barnett had even went to Gallenstein's home earlier in the night, before going to Spencer's home.

When Jascoviak and other lawmen arrested Barnett they first read him his rights and he made no statement other than "I want to talk to my attorney," according to Jascoviak's testimony.

Jaskoviak also testified that Barnett "was drinking (alcohol) upon our arrival at his house."

Judge Kuster listened intently during Jascoviak's testimony.

Pollard called no witnesses on Barnett's behalf and Judge Kuster quickly ruled that probable cause on Barnett's murder charge had been established and bound that charge over to a future Robertson County Grand Jury. Barnett remains lodged in the Bourbon County Regional Jail.

All persons are considered innocent until proven guilty or pleading guilty.





## Caleb Pope earns All-State Honorable Mention nod from Courier-Journal

Record-setting Nicholas County High School senior running back Caleb Pope has claimed another honor. The Louisville Courier-Journal has tabbed Pope as an All-State Honorable Mention selection at his running back position.

Pope excelled throughout his senior season, rushing 251 times for 2,338 yards and 28 touchdowns. The productive Pope averaged

213 yards and 2.5 touchdowns rushing per game for the Nicholas County High School football team.
